





new struggles for most of those who live there. Clean water is available but must be carried by most families from a water source in the city and electricity is a luxury that most cannot afford. Gooffrey attended school until the 11th grade but was forced to quit when his family could not afford the cost of attendance. After working for four years, he was able to finish high school and felt a calling on his life from God.

Geoffrey knew only of a Catholic school in Kenya that trained priests and other leaders in the Catholic Church. In the early 1980's he began to take religious study courses and later taught others within the school. He told me that he was hoping to become a priest at some point but was asked to go

to a city about two hundred miles from his home to work as a teacher. Geoffrey described going to the Catholic Church on Sundays and the services lasting for only one hour.

He said that each week he walked by another church, a Christian church, in that city that worshipped until three or four in the afternoon and he began to go there after services at the Catholic Church. Geoffrey said that this church was very "different" and very exciting. He said he attended for quite some time until one day he decided to place his faith and his life in Jesus Christ!

Geoffrey described experiencing the power of the Holy Spirit during the next few years. He shared how God opened doors for him to come to America, attend seminary at Lee University in

Chattanooga TN and how his whole family was eventually granted U.S. citizenship. He smiled as he described having a daughter serving as an officer in the U.S. Army and a son in the U.S. Air Force. He bragged about another daughter receiving a nursing degree and who is now teaching other nurses in Chattanooga. It sounds like God blessed Geoffrey with the American dream doesn't it? But wait.... There is much more!

Geoffrey said that in the mid 1990's, God placed a burden on his heart for the people of his hometown in Kenya. He said that after finishing seminary, he returned to Kenya and planted a church that has grown to over one hundred members. He shared stories with us

of how God has used him to reach others outside of Naivashia and how there are still so many people that need Jesus in Kenya. Geoffrey stated that he has seen over seventy five people accept Jesus since I saw him last summer!

He then began to describe how God has continually provided means for him to fly back to Chattanooga every year to visit his family and seek partnerships with fellow Christians who have a desire to spread the gospel to the nations. After a few weeks of rest and visitation each year, Geoffrey heads back to Kenya where he continues to serve in the church and assist numerous other small churches in the villages outside of Naivashia. 



Some chairs, a sound system and some fonds for a vehicle...... He asked if I knew of a doctor that might give him a checkup and a dentist that might be willing to clean his teeth while he is in. When discussing his desire to start an orphan-

age in Naivashia, I asked Geoffrey what he was lacking to get it going. His response was simple; "We need clean water." He said he has submitted a plan to the Kenyan government, God had provided a building, the need for an orphanage is tremendous but that he could not properly provide for children unless he had clean water to cook and clean with. Geoffrey told me the cost of drilling a well education for this wan-

and placing two large storage tanks on his property will be around \$28,000 U.S. dollars. While I was thinking to myself that many Christians in our area don't even tithe, much less invest that kind of money to provide basic needs around the world Geoffrey said this, "I am not worried, God will provide when He is ready, He always does." (That was a time for repentance and

nabe missionary!)
