she had been sexually assaulted by a male subject located on Gay Street in Loudon. The callers, who was able to get out of the apartment and back into her own apartment, advised the male subject was also assaulting his wife. the caller also advised 911 the male subject warned if the police were called, he would kill his wife. Upon arrival officers discovered a female subject, later identified as the sexual assault victim, distraught in

the upstairs area. Officers then attempted to make contact with the individuals located inside the other apartment. When the officers received no response from within the apartment and fearing the female inside was in imminent danger, officers kicked the door in and made entry.

Once inside the apartment and intoxicated male identified as Jess Ferguson. Officers also located a female, the vicitm of the domestic assault, hiding in a closet. It was discovered

Jess became angry when his verbal and physical attempts to have sexual relations with both women at the same time were denied. Jess then ripped his wife's shirt apart in an attempt to expose her breasts. As the other female party fled the apartment, it is reported Jess then advised if the police were called he would kill his wife. Jess then attempted to strike the victim of the domestic numerous times with his hands, which resulted in her hiding and shielding herself from him in a closet.

In another warrant for sexual assault, Jess Ferguson committed the offense of sexual assault after he touched the victim in her private areas on top of her clothing. This was all done in an attempt to get the victim to have sexual relations with he and hte other vicitm. Jess also tried to rip the victims shirt off and at one point attempted to pull her pants down. Ferguson was very intoxicated at the time according to both victims.

Jess E. Ferguson, 31, of Gay Street, Loudon, was charged with assault by domestic violence and sexual assault. Officer Sam Harrison and Detec-




