Paul Baker, 44 HWY 72 Loudon, was charged with Manufacturing Methamphetamine, Felony possession of drug paraphernalia, & simple possession of SCH II.


Juanita Melton-Baker, 32 MTN View Rd. Sweetwater, was charged with Manufacturing Methamphetamine, & Felony Possession drug Paraphernalia.

According to reports, Agents from the 9th DTF and Investigators from Loudon Police Dept. received information about a possible Meth Lab in the RV park. Agents made contact with occupants of the suspected residence and spoke with them outside the trailer. During the conversation the owner of the trailer, Paul Baker, stated that he had Methadone pills in his pocket. Mr. Baker produced those pills and gave them to agents. Mr. Baker then stated upon asking that he had all the necessary components to manufacture Methamphetamine.

Mr. Baker gave consent to search the residence or camper. During the search all com-

ponents necessary to manufacture Meth were located as well as two one pot shake bottles. Also present at the time of this incident was the wife of Mr. Baker, Juanita Melton-Baker. During an interview it was determined that these individuals had manufactured Meth earlier that morning and were using meth as agents were knocking on the door. Juanita Melton-Baker has a lengthy history of pseudoephedrine purchases and has two prior lab seizures. Both were arrested. Brendan
