Christ. As you read this true account, consider yourself as the Ethiopian Eunuch that God is calling unto Himself. If you are a Christian, how many times has God planned to use you in the way He used Phillip, and did you obey the nudge of The Holy Spirit when He called?

Acts 8:26-40 (NKJV) Now an angel of the Lord spoke to Phillip, saying, "Arise and go toward the south along the

road which goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." This is desert. So he arose and went. And behold, a man of Ethiopia, a eunuch of great authority under Cadace the queen of the Ethiopians, who had charge of all of her treasury, and had come to Jerusalem to worship, was returning. And sitting in his chariot, he was reading Isaiah the prophet. Then the Spirit said to Phillip, "Go near and overtake this chariot."

So Phillip ran to him, and heard him reading the prophet

Isaiah, and said, "Do you understand what you are reading?" And he said, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he asked Phillip to come up and sit with him. The place in the Scripture which he read was this:

"He was led as sheep to the slaughter; And as a lamb before its shearer is silent, So He opened not His mouth. In His humiliation His justice was taken away, And who will declare His generation? For His life is taken from the earth."

So the eunuch answered Phillip and said, "I ask you, of whom does the prophet say this, of himself or of some other man?" Then Phillip opened his mouth, and beginning at this scripture, preached Jesus to him. Now as they went down the road, they came to some water. And the eunuch said, "See, here is water. What hinders me from being baptized?" Then Phillip said, "If you believe with all your heart, you may." And he answered and said, "I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God."

So he commanded the chariot to stand still. And both Phillip and the eunuch went down into the water, and he baptized him. Now when they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught Phillip away, so that the eunuch saw him no more; and he went on his way rejoicing. But Phillip was found at Azotus. And passing through, he preached in all the cities till he came to Caesarea.

The Holy Spirit of God sent Phillip to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with a man that God had prepared, God saved the eunuch when he believed on Jesus and then Phillip was immediately transplanted to Azotus to continue God's work from there to Caesarea. This is an awesome example of God using individual people to accomplish His will in other individual people! How much more does God want to

use you and me to share the gospel of Jesus Christ with the people within our sphere of influence?

God may not move you or me from one physical location to another in a single instant as He did Phillip that day, but isn't it awesome to know that the God of heaven could do so if He wanted to? Isn't it amazing to know that God, who created the universe, controls the wind, the sun, the rain, the seas, and even our every breath, will use us to accomplish His work on earth if we will only trust Him and listen when He speaks to us?

I pray that each time the Holy Spirit of God directs me to share my faith in Christ with someone that He has prepared, that I am listening. It is a duty and a privilege of all believers to keep our lives Godly, our hearts pure, our minds on our mission and our eyes on Jesus. God will speak through us to reach the nations if only we will take up our cross and follow Him. (Luke 9:23)

Thanks for taking time to read today and I pray that if you have never placed your trust in Jesus that you don't wait another day. God loves you, Jesus died for you and just as the Ethiopian eunuch in the story above found eternal salvation through faith in Christ, you can as well today.
