





Sara Faye Lowe, 28, of Millsaps Road, Greenback,, was charged with failure to



City has, at some point in their career, worked a case with or attended training with this detective that I am so proud to call my friend. There are some people in our lives that just seem to have always been there and we cannot imagine a time that they're not around; Jonathan Sartin is that guy.

For me, it began when I was barely an adult and my daily activities consisted of avoiding the police in Lenoir City, especially the guy they called "Sartin" who had a drug sniffing dog named "Rocky". He was all business and a hoodlem's worst nightmare. I am ashamed of the young man I was in those days and if I had

been caught by Jonathan doing some of the things I was doing back then I would not have been a good candidate for a police officer in later years.

As I grew a little older and decided to pursue a career in law enforcement, I got to Jonathan perknow sonally and developed a deep respect for the way he dealt with people and dedicated himself to the relentless pursuit of a safer community. It has never been uncommon to see him working late at night, on the weekends or during any event in Lenoir City in which he thought he might be able to help. This kind of law enforcement commitment is seldom found today and Jona-

than maintained that motivation even until his last breath.

A few years ago he and I attended a week child abduction training in Denver Colorado together, along with a couple of other officers from our area. I ashamedly was a heavy drinker in those days and encouraged Sartin to join me for drinks almost daily. I am now glad that he never succumbed to my relentless peer pressure, but instead insisted that he drive the rest of us around until well after midnight each eveand out of trouble. The day before we all left Colorado, Sartin drove us through the Rocky

Mountain National Park where we stopped at almost every view- vided for him throughing area and repeatedly out his life. About a year ago I met Jonathan to deliver some survival bracelets that I had made for him and we talked for some time about what God is doing in mine and Blondie's lives. He told me that he was proud of our decision to folning to keep us safe low Christ and excited to see how God will use us in the future. Jonathan then shared with me about his relation-

ship with Christ and how God had also proof his current 10-20 (if you will).
