### Elderly Abuse

According to the reports, Lt. Detective Patrick Upton, LCSO CID was dispatched to the TA Truck Stop on Watt Road in Lenoir City to help deputies Scarbrough and Bowen to investigate a possible elderly abuse.

Upon arrival the Lt. was advised by deputies the victim, an 83 year old woman, had been transported by ambulance to Ft. Sanders Loudon

ER for possible multiple injuries. Upon further investigation deputies advised an employee of the TA truck stop had found the victim almost unresponsive inside the cab of a Uhaul. The victim had feces all over her and had dogs tied to a chain and the chain was also rubbing the victim.

Deputy Scarbrough advised the victim could not stand on her own. Upon further investigation it was learned Pamela Atkins and Charles Mathis

were on their way from North Carolina to Oklahoma.

Lt. Upton went to Ft. Sanders Loudon and the victim was suffering from very low blood pressure, dehydration and had to have medical attention also due to fecal matter and her clothes stuck to her body. The victim was taken to ICU because of her condition. During an interview both Mrs. Atkins and Mr. Mathis admitted proper care was not taken to insure the victims health.

Pam Michele Atkins, 54, homeless and Charles Edward Mathis, 40, also homeless, were charged with elderly abuse.

Lt. Patrick Upton, LCSO CID made the arrest and filed the charges.


