was found to be involved in the manufacture of meth on several occasions over the last few days specifically just prior to his arrest. William Crew disposed of two plastic bags out of the passenger side of an Isuzu Trooper driven by Jeremy Palmer while traveling down Steckee Road.

Agents were conducting surveillance of with manufacturing the two males and recovered the bags that (school zone). Agent were discarded. These bags contained one shake bottle, containing the components that when combined produce methamphetamine, a rubber hose, coffee filters and other meth related trash. The evidence recovered, or "meth lab"

was found to be taken from a house where the chemical reaction and mixture of chemicals occurred at 209 Hope Way in Loudon. Agents watched Jeremy Palmer and William Crew put these bags in the vehicle at the residence, which is within 1000 feet of a middle and elementary school.
