combative and was taken to the ground and handcuffed. Officer T. Buckner, LCPD made the arrest.



As far as I knew, he never got angry, never raised his voice and NEVER said words that could not be repeated in church. This being the case, we knew we were in trouble and a tornado would not have moved us from the couch that day. My papaw has now gone on to be with the Lord and I miss him. would not disclose this story to discredit my papaw's faith or have anyone think less of him, but I am using this incident to share the gospel of Jesus Christ and I am confident that papaw would be fine with that. The point of the story is that I even remember it happening at all! The words he spoke in frustration with a bunch of unruly kids made such an impression on me that I have never forgotten it. This is only because they were not the words that I expected to hear from someone who, as far as I knew, had the

Lord on speed dial!

As I considered today's text, I couldn't help but wonder how many times each day I allow words to exit my face that are not positive, not encouraging and do not glorify the name of Christ. I'm not just referring to curse words (as God has rescued me from the filthy language that I once spoke) but I wonder how many times each day that I speak negatively about another person, judge the words and actions of someone or just speak with a poor attitude that may cause a lost person to second guess my commitment to Christ.


As I studied the following text from the Book of James, I was both ashamed of myself for not being more cautious with my words and thankful that Jesus is using this study to draw me into a closer relationship with Himself. Consider your words as we dive into Chapter 3;

James 3:1-12 (NKJV)


(1) My brethren, let not many of you become teachers, knowing that we shall receive stricter judgment. (2) For we allstumble in many things. If anyone does not stumble in word, he is a perfect man, able also to bridle the whole body. (3) Indeed, we put bits in horses' mouths that they may obey us, and we turn their whole body. (4) Look also at ships: although they are so large and are driven by fierce winds, they are turned by a very small rudder wherever the pilot desires. (5) Even so the tongue is a small member and boasts great things. See how great a forest a little fire kindles! (6) And the tongue is a fire, a world of iniquity. The tongue is so set among our members that it defiles the whole body, and sets on fire the course of nature; and it is set on fire by hell. (7) For every kind of beast and bird, of

reptile and creature of the sea, is tamed and has been tamed by mankind. (8) But no man can tame the tongue. It is an unruly evil, full of deadly poison. (9) With it we bless our God and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in the similitude of God. (10) Out of the same mouth proceed blessing and cursing. My brethren, these things ought not to be so. (11) Does a spring send forth fresh water and bitter from the same opening? (12) Can a fig tree, my brethren, bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Thus no spring yields both salt water and fresh.

I was talking with a friend the other day who also professes to be a Christian. During our conversation my friend realized that he/she had just used several curse words and remembered that I no longer talk that way. My friend then apologized

for the foul language and stated that "Cussing is my only vice".

My friend considers cursing as a "lesser" offense when compared to the "Big Sins" such as adultery, murder, etc. According to today's scripture, this is a dangerous practice that we, as Christians, should consider every time we begin to speak. God is no longer sending prophets or judges to guide His people regarding His plan; He is sending individuals, like you and I, to the uttermost parts of the world to carry the gospel of Jesus Christ to all nations using one method..... Our words! We no longer need prophets to share God's will because Christ, through the Holy Spirit, now lives within us when we trust in Him! God gave us words to carry the gospel to all nations but we cannot be effective in leading others to Christ if our words are filled with

hate, anger, jealousy, envy, wrath, judgment, cursing, bitterness or anything other than the love that Jesus Christ has for the lost.

Verse 12 reminds us that a spring cannot yield both salt water and fresh water. This means that we can't have it both ways... we must love Christ and honor Him with our speech as if every word matters. As you go through the day today, choose your words carefully and ask yourself the following question; am I honoring God with each conversation I have? Or am I blessing and cursing from the same lips?

The old saying is truly a myth; "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but your words can never hurt me." The real truth today is that our words will either encourage folks to Consider Jesus, or our words relay to others that we are not serious about seeing our friends and neighbors come to Christ.

I have decided to care-

fully consider my words before I allow them to spew from my lips so that those with whom I speak

will only see the love of Christ in my words, as well as my actions. Will you join me?
