ing detained for questioning. Crider became very angry and began making threats to find the detective when he gets out.

Crider stated he was a gangster and Lenoir City was too small for Condee to hide, so he would find the detective. A patrol unit was dispatched to transport Crider to jail. While attempting to put Crider into the back seat of the patrol car, he threw his right elbow out

and struck Detective Condee in the left tricep area. Crider eventually complied with commands and sat down in the patrol car. Crider was then transported to the jail and during a search by Deputy Ferguson he discovered in Criders' sock a small corner baggie. The baggie contained several pieces of suspected crack cocaine. Utilizing surveillance video, Crider was identified as the person who stole \$53.33 in gasoline from Weigel's. Additionally, Crider

was positively identified as being in possession of a stolen vehicle, valued at over \$500. Crider unlawfully sold the vehicle to an unwitting third party on the same day the vehicle had been reported stolen from Knoxville.
