Michelle R. Payne, 37 Mount Lebanon Rd. Maryville, was charged with Theft over \$10,000.00. According to the report Deputy ar-



ecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the state and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the assistance of counsel for his defense.

I am not so sure I would have used the word enjoy for anything criminal! By today's standard however; it seems many criminals enjoy more than average citizens, but that is another blog for another day.

In all criminal prosecutions the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy...Who determines when a speedy trial is? What is considered speedy? What about delaying for witnesses or new evidence? Why is this allowed if a speedy trial is to be had? What if a criminal is found to be guilty, but a judge rules the trial was not speedy enough? Would you be able to argue the points made via Fifth Amendment?

...and public trial,... Who determines what is a public trial? With today's technology, isn't everything eventually public? Who determines when cases can be closed to the public and is this a violation of the First

Amendment? In the interest of public safety, who determines public safety and what is being

What is impartial? Of non relation, not the same race, ethnicity, age etc? Who determines this, how and why? What if the crime was committed outside of the country? Who determines where a trial is conducted?

...to be confronted with the witnesses against him... OK, this is where it starts getting tricky. What if a witness cannot be in court? Say they are in the hospital and cannot leave. What then? Are witnesses required at all trials and at all times in a trial? In cases of witness identification upon arrest, is this still a requirement? When is it not? What if the witness passes or was killed before faceto-face witness? Will his/her admission be allowed in trial?

...to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor... Pretty straight forward. If a criminal is on trial, they have the right to call witnesses to vouch for them. I really don't have a question for this one, do you?

... and to have the assistance of counsel for his defense. OK. This one is interesting. Upon first glance you would think this is a cut and dry statement. However; State courts

were not obligated to provide representation trials can be closed, but until much later in history. Even now, this is not the case. For considered unsafe? example; if you get ..impartial jury of the a speeding ticket the state is not required to provide you with an attorney, although you are breaking a law and that would be considcriminal offense. Make sense?

> You must remember that as these Rights were being written, there were no states and as the country changes these rights must also change. But, the best question is, to what extent? Although there are ten original rights, we have added new amendments and clauses to these amendments by law over the years. A firm grasp of what the original meanings were gives each of us insight as to how they are able to grow and what we are capable of as a government. Without knowledge of our past, we cannot protect our future.
