
A Kingston man was charged with his fourth driving under the influence charge after he reportedly struck another vehicle in the rear after he lost control of his vehicle.

Jesse Ward was placed under arrest. Deputy Brandon Dixon LCSO made the arrest.





In 1965, a court case in Connecticut was sent to the Supreme Court to be ruled upon using the phrase, right to privacy. Two Justices ruled against this, saying the Constitution does not specifically state a right to Privacy, therefore, it does not exist. However; the ninth amendment tells us that we have that right, even if not explicitly stated in the Bill of Rights.
