He used a chart showing that his office has one ADA to 27,295 persons when the state average for the other 30 DAG offices was one ADA to only 15,669 persons. "We cover four counties, appear before five judges and we are in court every day of the week, sometimes in three different counties at the same time." Johnson explained, "So, especially when showed the Conference and the State the 'apples to apples' comparison with the number of ADAs other offices have, they were finally able to create us a 'near entry level' position in order to add another ADA." General Johnson described his new employee as 'good fit'. "Terry

will fill the bill nicely. He has been practicing with Sandy McPherson for about three years, so he already has some experience. He knows the judges, the defense lawyers and the court system in our district. The judges, lawyers and clerks are all familiar with him and, when I started looking for a person for this position, his name was first on almost everyone's list of recommendations."
