Once on the ground Locklear did not comply with verbal commands and soft empty hand technique had to be used to take Locklear into custody. Locklear had a very strong odor of alcohol coming from his person which was more pronounced when he (Locklear) would speak. Locklear was unable to stand up right and while at the Loudon County Jail did refuse to conduct Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks. Jonathan Morgan, 25, 9th Ave West, was charged with Domestic Assault & Theft of property.


According to victim statement, she went to the defendant residence to ask him to return the tools that he had stolen from
