hicle on multiple occasions. Deputy Burley did utilize the X-26 Taser on Locklear. Once on the ground Locklear did not comply with verbal commands and soft empty hand technique had to be used to take Locklear into custody. Locklear had a very strong odor of alcohol coming from his person which was more pronounced when he (Locklear) would speak. Locklear was unable to stand up right and while at the Loudon County Jail did refuse to conduct Standardized Field Sobri-

ety Tasks. While Deputy Burley was explaining Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks, Locklear was unable to stand up right. Locklear was read and refused Tennessee Implied Consent as well. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO made the arrest.
