A Loudon man received his third driving under the influence charge after he was stopped for having no brake lights.

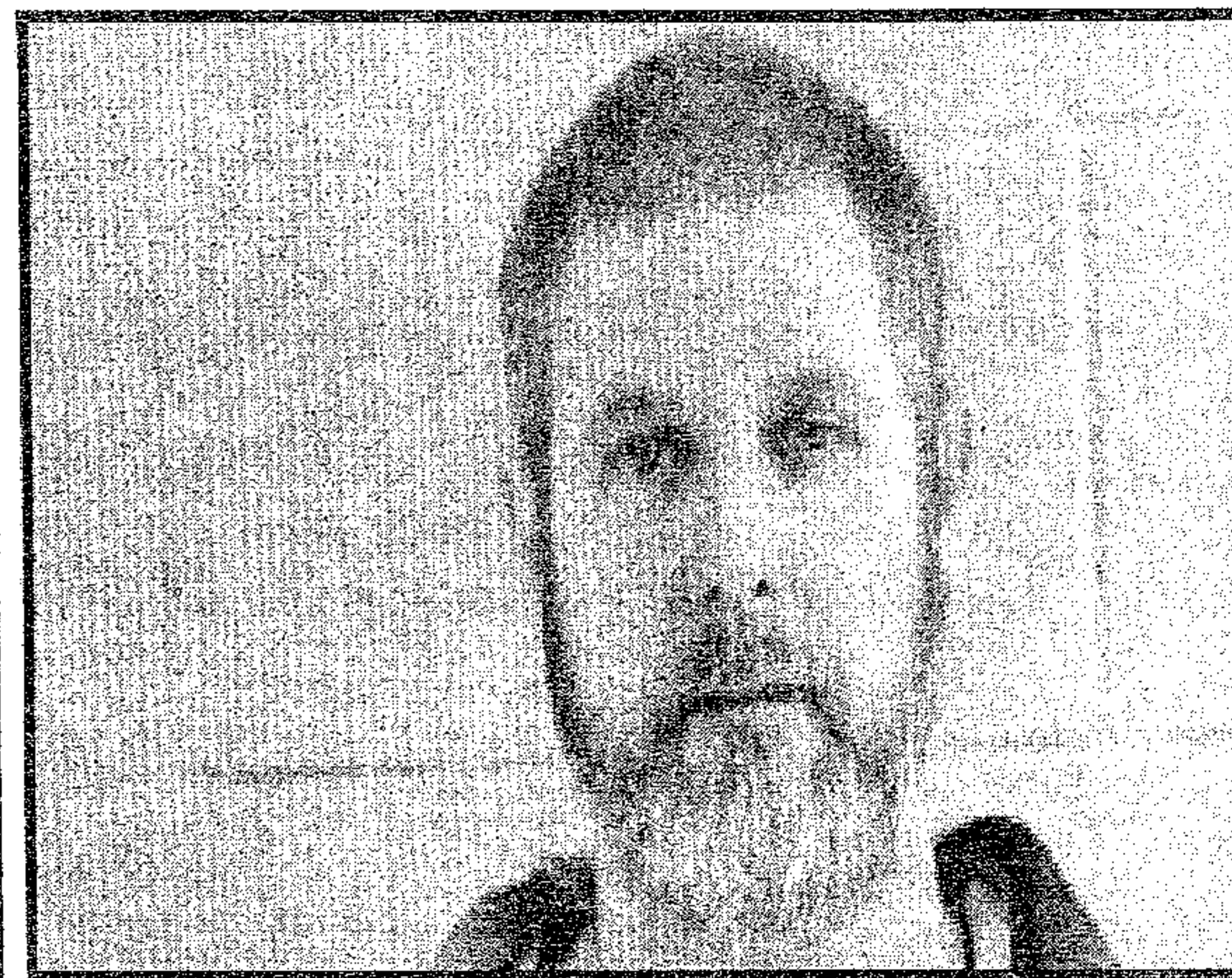
