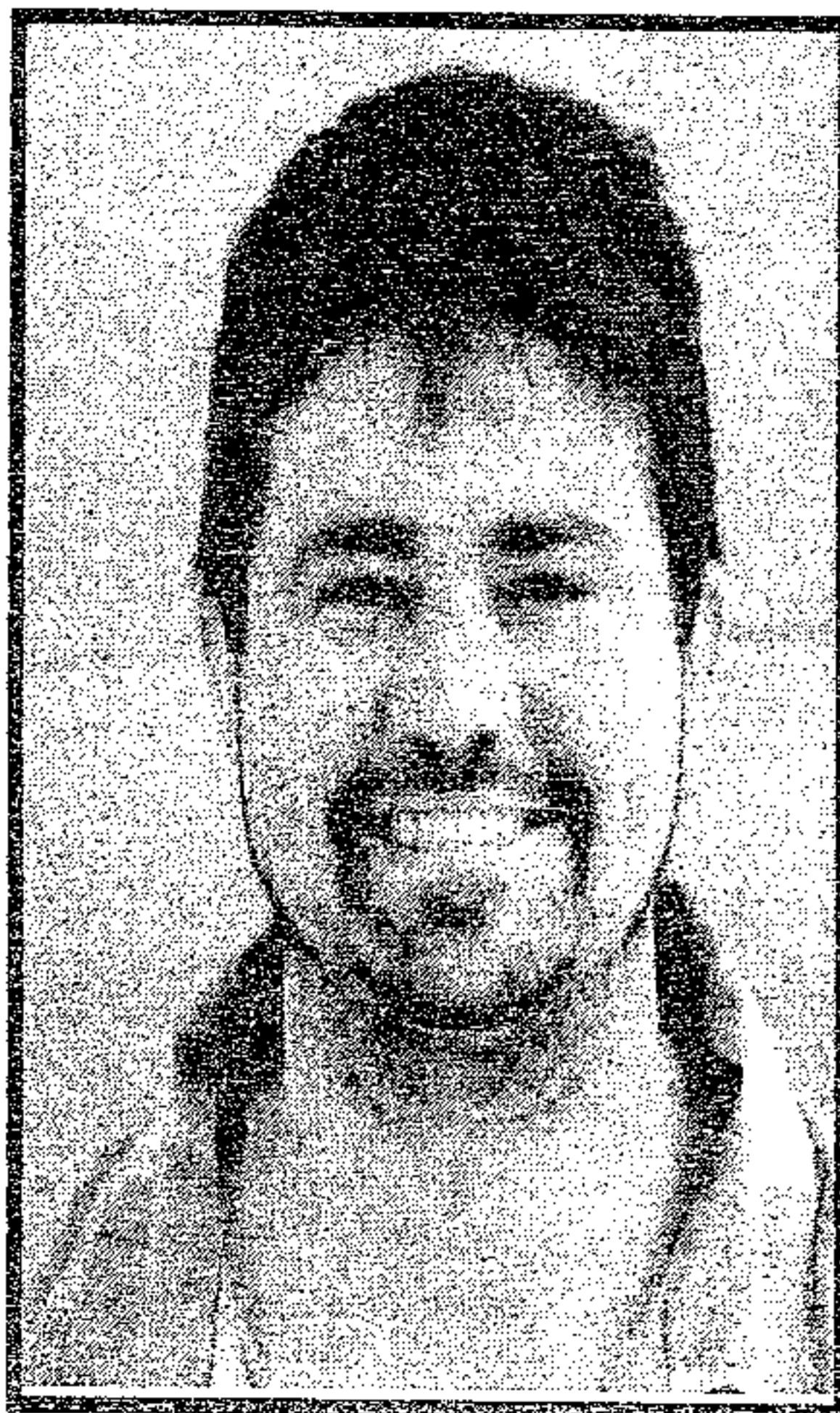
case. These beers were still cold, despite the interior temperature of the vehicle being extremely warm.
