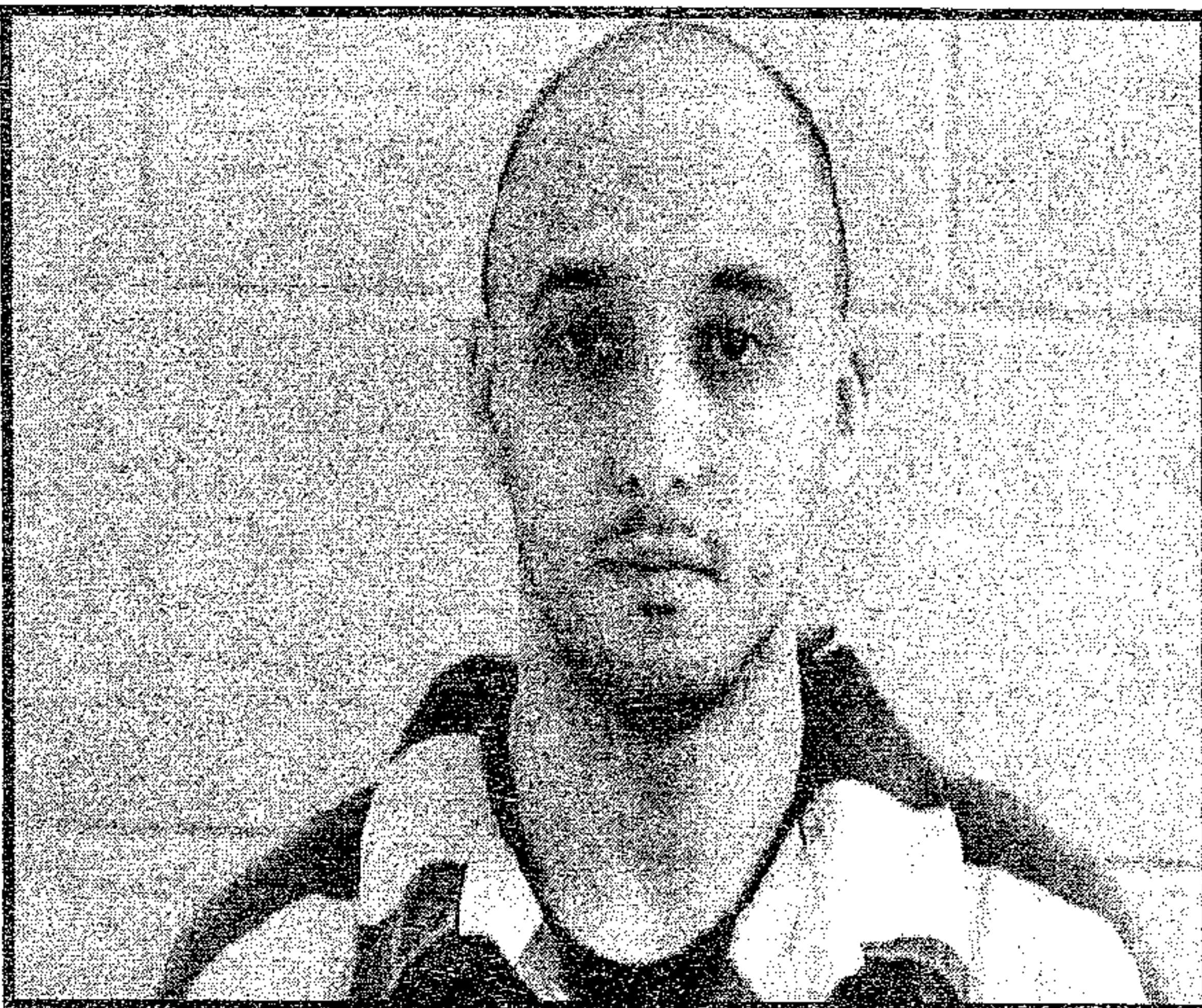

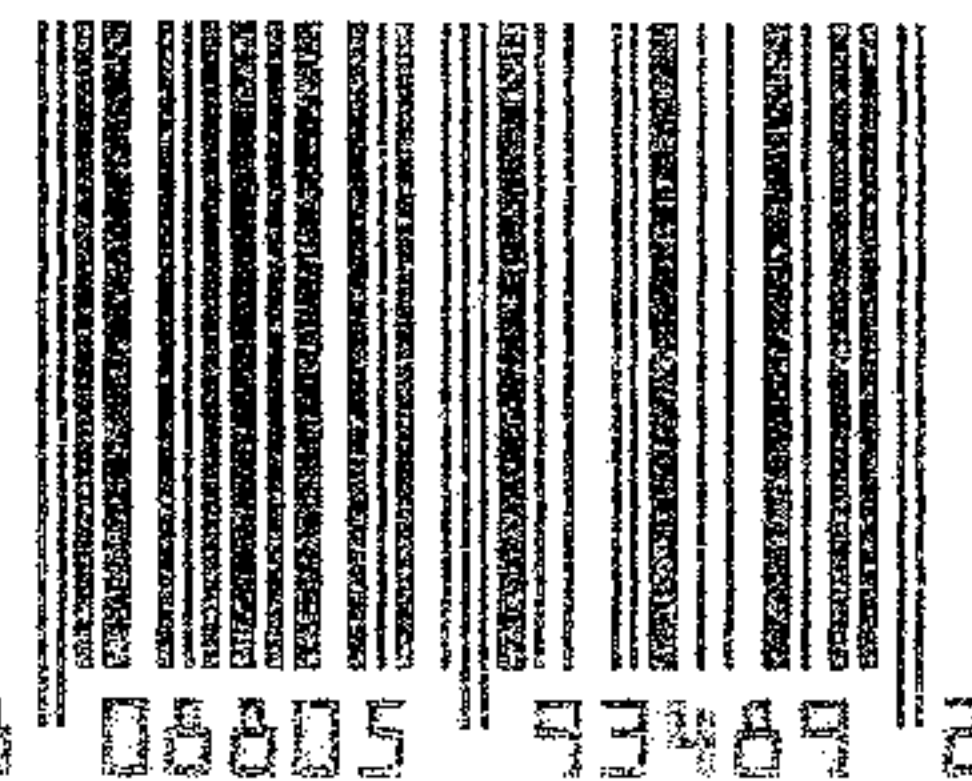

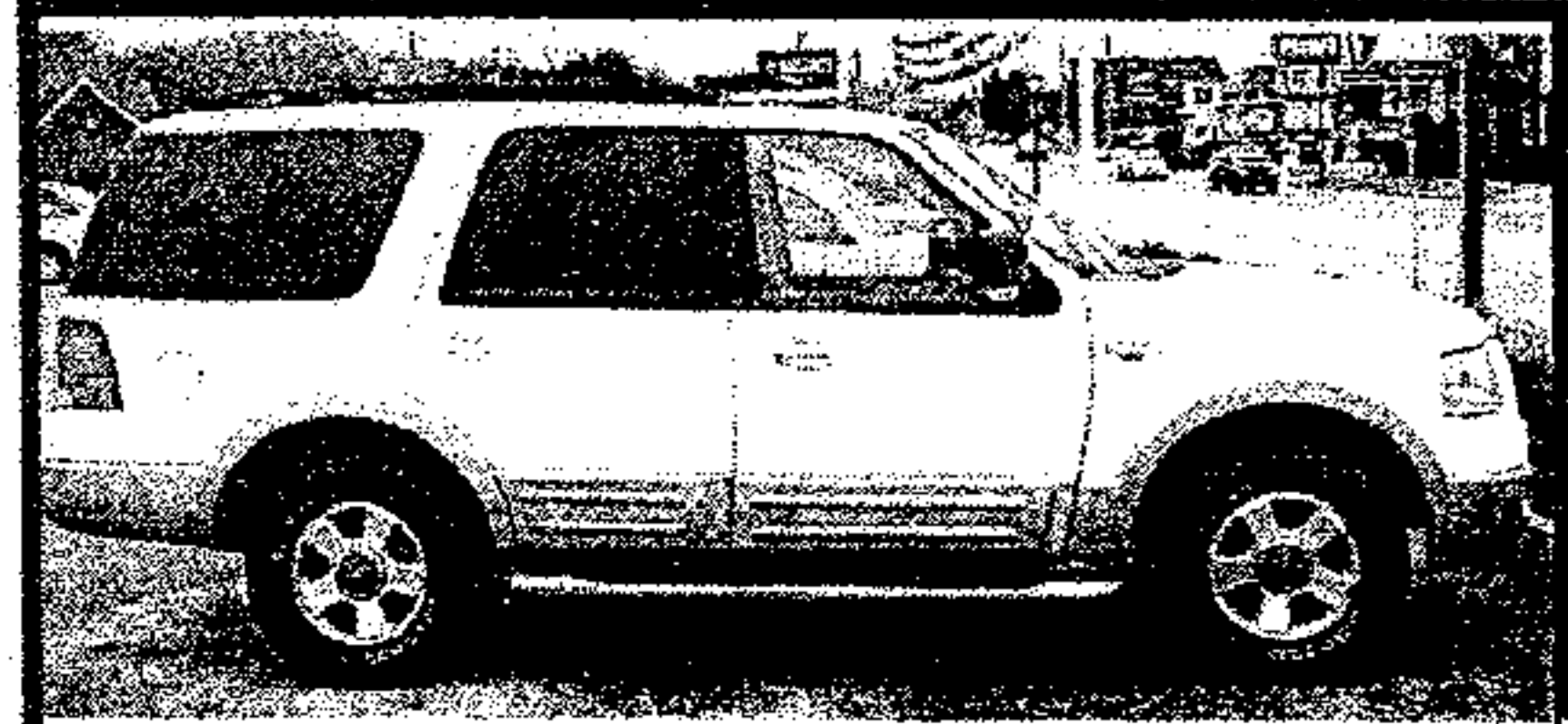

## Charged

Michael Weeden, 41, Apache Street Athens, was charged with Domestic Assault.

According to report on 12/22/13 the defendant Michael Weeden did physically assault his girlfriend the victim. Weeden traveled to the place where the victim is employed. The victim had driven Weeden vehicle to work that day, however the victim and Weeden had been arguing and Weeden apparently decided to reclaim possession of his truck. The victim walked outside into the parking lot and attempted to retrieve her purse. Weeden then closed the window of the truck on the victim arm trapping it between the window and door frame. The victim began screaming for Weeden to lower the window.

Weeden lowered it slightly, and the victim attempted to remove her arm from the opening, again Weeden rolled the window back up on the victim arm trapping victim again.

Weeden also began to drive the truck forward with the victim arm trapped inside. Weeden eventually allowed the victim to remove her arm before law enforcement arrived. The victim was in fear of death or serious injury and did suffer significant bruising to her left upper arm.

Detective Kevin Condee LCPD, issued a Domestic Assault Warrant on Michael. Deputy Bob Gray LCSO, served the Assault Warrant on

Michael at the McMinn Co. Jail and transported him to Loudon Jail.

Betina Cansler, 40, Easter Drive Loudon, was charged with Contraband in penal institution, Maintaining a dwelling drugs sold, and Manufacturing/sell/poss. Of controlled substance.

Alicia Partin, 22, Nelson St. Philadelphia was charged with Tampering/fabricating with evidence, and Promotion of methamphetamine manufacturing.

Natosha Cozart, 28, Maple Hill Lane Loudon, was charged with Promotion of

Methamphetamine, Poss. Of Drug Para., and Assisting other agency.

Gabriel Ogle, 28, Sweetwater Road Sweetwater, was charged with Promotion of methamphetamine manufacture.

The Loudon County Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit was called to assist Deputy Brandon Dixon and Cpl. Mike Watkins at Easter Dr, Loudon, on a possible meth lab. When the Narcotics Unit arrived on scene, Investigator Marty Stanley obtained written consent from Betina Cansler to search the residence and the property which she rents and had control of. Cansler advised she lives at the residence maintains the residence as her home. A one pot shake bottle, a plastic bottle with plastic tubing (gas generator), and lithium backing strips were found

in a bedroom inside the residence. A black backpack was found outside the residence in a grown up area next to the fence line which runs near the residence. Two boxes of instant cold packs, a gallon bottle of Muriatic Acid, a measuring cup, a container of Crystal Heat drain cleaner, a blue pill crusher, two pairs of pliers, and coffee filters were found inside the black backpack. These items are used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. While on scene, Deputy Dixon was advised by a neighbor that Alicia Partin exited the back door of the residence and placed the black backpack next to the fence in an attempt to hide the backpack from law enforcement. Natosha Cozart and Gabriel Ogle were found inside

the residence as well. After checking two databases, it was found that both Ogle and Cozart had purchased pseudoephedrine products two days prior to officer's arrival. During a Mirandized interview, Ogle advised the pseudoephedrine purchased he purchased was intended to be used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. Betina Cansler was taken into custody and transported to the Loudon County Jail. Upon arrival at the jail, Cansler was searched and a small, multicolored pill container was found in her private area. 3 3/4 round green pills identified as Diazepam, and 1 1/2 round white pills identified as Suboxone were found inside the container. Inv. Shane Ezell LCSO made the arrest.
