Weeden also began to drive the truck forward with the victim arm trapped inside. Weeden eventually allowed the victim to remove her arm before law enforcement arrived. The victim was in fear of death or serious injury and did suffer significant bruising to her left upper arm.

When the Narcotics Unit arrived on scene, Investigator Marty Stanley obtained written consent from Betina Cansler to search the residence and the property which she rents and had control of. Cansler advised she lives at the residence maintains the residence as her home. A one pot shake bottle, a plastic bottle with plastic tubing (gas generator), and lithium backing strips were found

a bedroom inside the residence. A black backpack was found outside the residence in a grown up area next to the fence line which runs near the residence. Two boxes of instant cold packs, a gallon bottle of Muriatic Acid, a measuring cup, a container of Crystal Heat drain cleaner, a blue pill crusher, two pairs of pliers, and coffee filters were found inside the black backpack. These items are used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. While on scene, Deputy Dixon was advised by a neighbor that Alicia Partin exited the back door of the residence and placed the black backpack next to the fence in an attempt to hide the backpack from law enforcement. Natosha Cozart and Gabriel Ogle were found inside made the arrest.

the residence as well. After checking two databases, it was found that both Ogle and Cozart had purchased pseudoephedrine products two days prior to officer's arrival. During a Mirandized interview, Ogle advised the pseudoephedrine purchased he purchased was intended to be used in the manufacture of methamphetamine. Upon arrival at the jail, Cansler was searched and a small, multicolored pill container was found in her private area. 3 3/4 round green pills identified as Diazepam, and 1 1/2 round white pills identified as Suboxone were found inside the container.
