### Sound Advice for the New Year





arrest on the existing warrants they had on him and charged him with criminal trespassing.



In that regard, He still allowed me the honor of leading at least one person to Him for eternal salvation and is now using my wife and I to share the gospel in Montana.

I should have this verse stamped onto my forehead! We often allow our mouths to destroy our witness as Christians, which rendered this verse mandatory for a better year than last for most of us.


