Greenback drug collection event scheduled

Saturday, November 1, the Loudon County Sheriff's Office will offer a Prescription Drug Collection event at Greenback First Presbyterian Church at 6790 Morganton Road in Greenback. Residents can take their expired, unneeded, or unwanted prescription drugs for safe disposal between 8 a.m. and 11 a.m. The service is free and anonymous, no questions asked. Drugs will

be disposed of by the Sheriff's Office Narcotics Unit. Pills and other solids, like patches, can be brought to the collection site, along with liquids, needles and other sharps. Unused medications in homes create a public health and safety concern, because they can be accidentally ingested, stolen, misused, and abused. The majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and

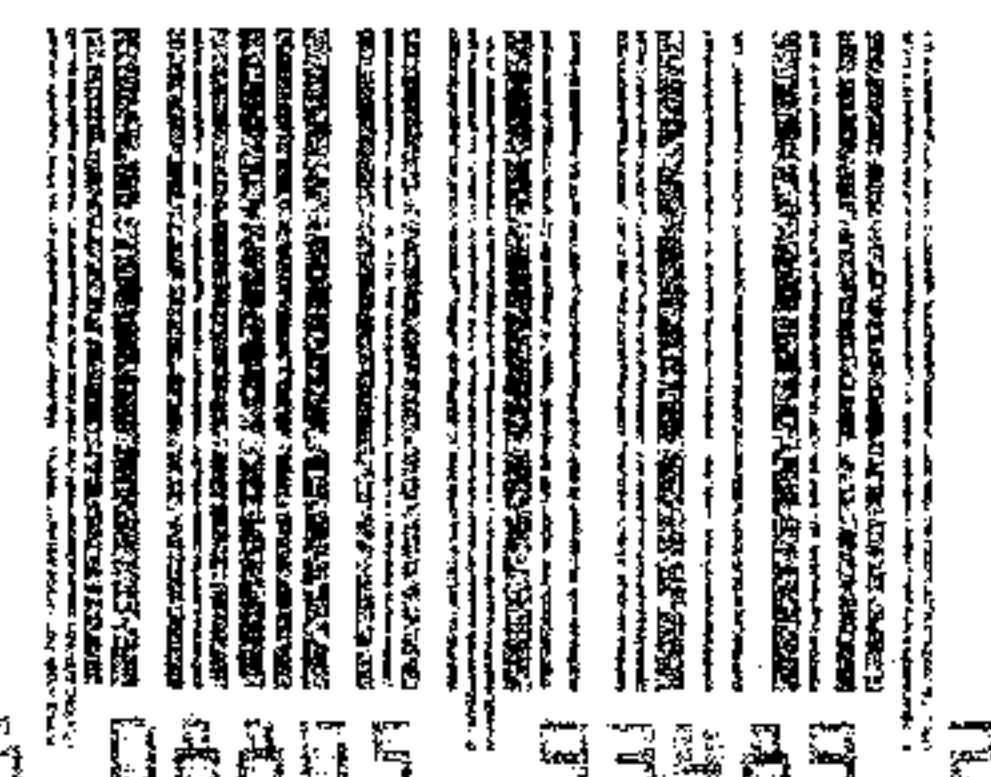

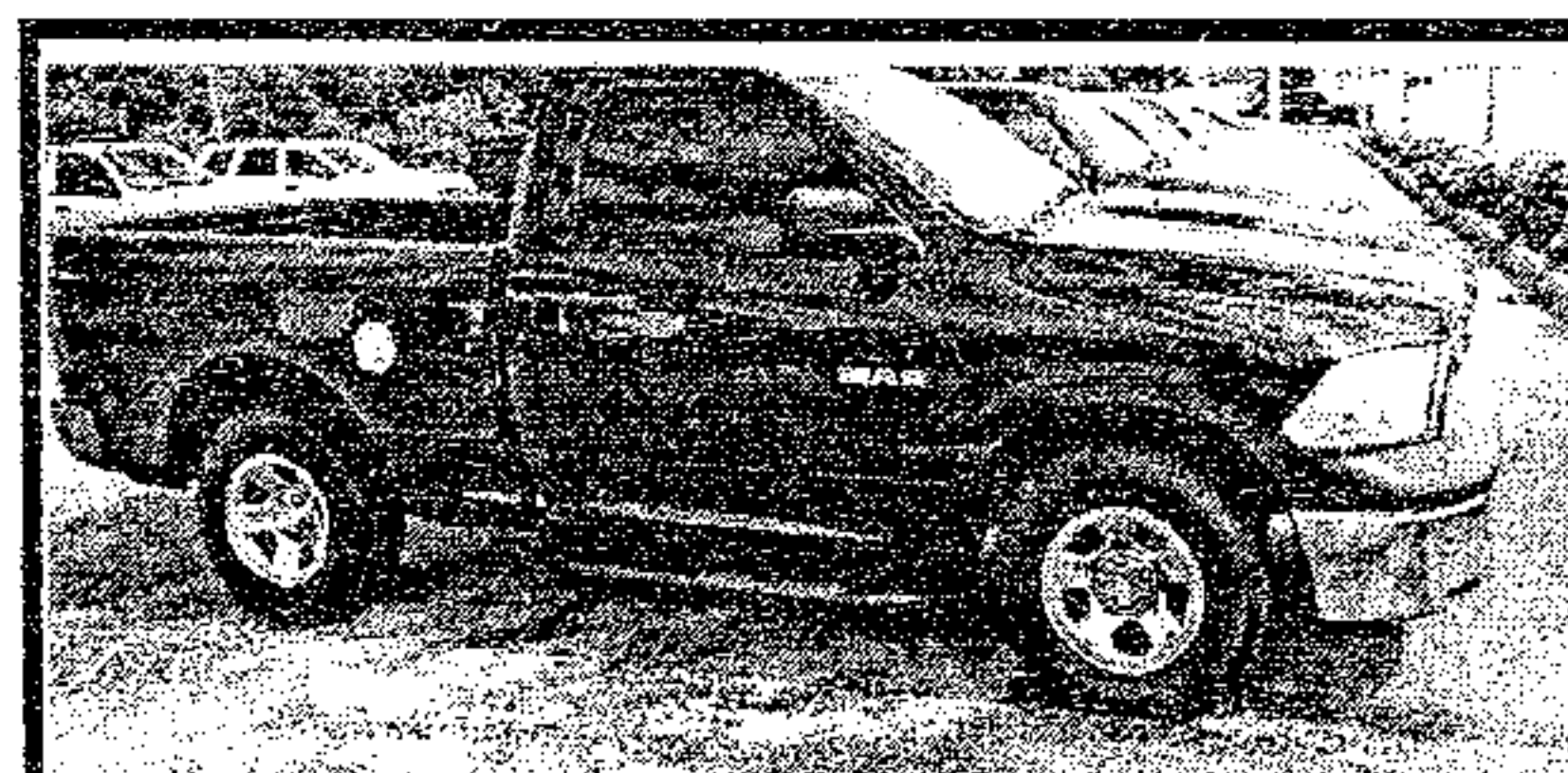

port, Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a vehicle traveling north on Steekee Rd, near Gentry's. Deputy in vehicle radar did register the vehicle's speed at 59 mph in a 45 mph zone. Deputy did initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle in the next safe location which was on Steekee at Hwy 72. Deputy identified the occupants of the vehicle as Carston Huffine, and the passenger. There was a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle, and Huffine's eyes were blood shot, speech was slurred and both Huffine and passenger appeared very nervous. Deputy asked both subjects to exit the vehicle, and once Deputy brought the odor of marijuana to Huffine's attention he stated that there was paraphernalia inside the vehicle and a small amount of marijuana. Both passenger and Huffine said that they had smoked marijuana inside the vehicle while in passenger's driveway just prior to our encounter. Both stated that Huffine did supply the marijuana that they smoked. A search of the vehicle revealed that there was approx. 8 grams of marijuana inside the center console, and 19 grams of marijuana

found inside a wooden box in the trunk of the vehicle.

The box in the trunk contained marijuana that was being dried and placed into bricks. Also was found two scales, one digital, one handheld, six marijuana pipes, a marijuana grinder, rolling papers, and several small baggies used to distribute marijuana. Inside the driver's door was found an air soft pistol with the orange tip painted

black, and with was found a billfold type container with a badge and fake credentials. The gun before further inspection led me to believe it was in fact a real pistol. Huffine was placed under arrest and transported to

the Loudon County Jail. With passenger being a juvenile, her parents were contacted and she was released to them once they arrived on scene. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.
