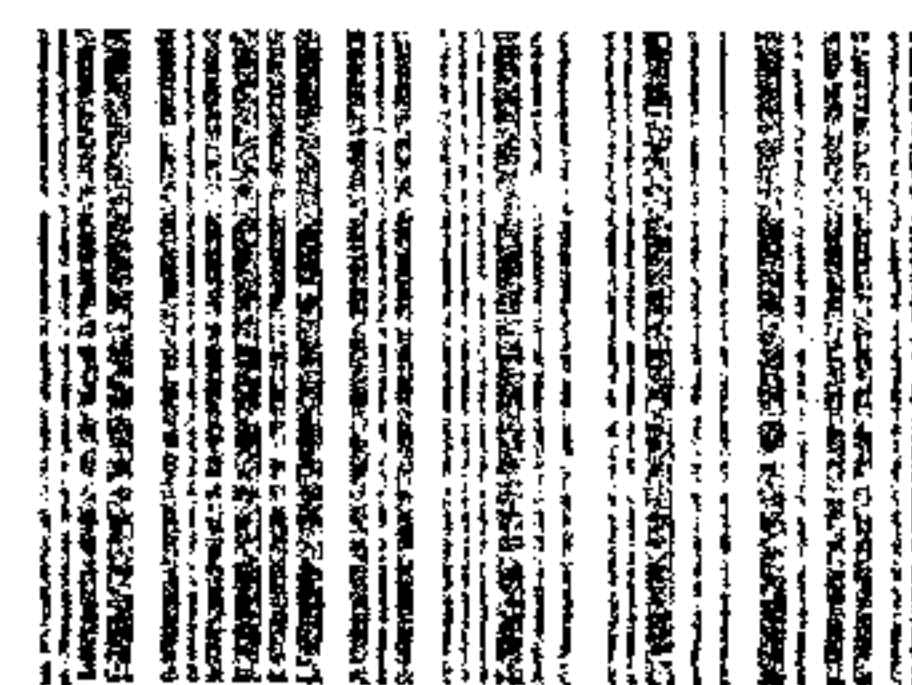

## Burglary

Trespass, Vandalism, Theft of Property, Resisting Arrest, Evading Arrest, and Public Intoxication.

According to the report, Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did respond to Stone Harbor Blvd for a burglary in progress, in which the victims were stating that an unknown white male, wearing red shorts, a white t-shirt, and flip flops was first knocking on their door, then banging, which then escalated to threats and kicking the door attempting to make entry. Deputy arrived on scene and he did notice at the corner of the residence there was someone, Caucasian, hiding behind a fence on the property. Deputy gave commands for the subject to come out from hiding at which point, the subject, matching the description given by the victims, did flee on foot away from Deputy.

Deputy deployed his K9 partner Dante and we did begin to track the subject. Another resident on the next street then advised perimeter Officers that the subject was seen coming out from behind Windward Pt then heading back in to the woods. Deputies

continued to track the subject, at which point SGT. Watkins and his K9 partner Derro did locate the subject hiding in the woods on the perimeter.

The subject identified by both the property he left behind at Stone Harbor, which included his wallet and ID, and by visual confirmation upon arrest was identified as Jonathan Key.

Key was also observed upon

arrest both appearing intoxicated, smelling strongly of alcoholic beverage and having both the outside and inside of his mouth covered in black spray paint. Once Key was secured,

Deputy returned to Stone Harbor to speak with the victims.

Deputy spoke with victims, who stated that they were awoken by their dog bark-secured.
