

FBI

Back in 2012, 20-year-old Tevon Harris—aka "Da Kidd" or "King Kidd"—didn't have a legitimate job. He lived on and off with his mother but mostly moved from one motel room to the next. And he was very good at manipulating people. Harris trolled social media websites looking for vulnerable young girls he could sexually exploit. Online, he complimented them. He offered them modeling jobs. And he promised them lots of money.

Some agreed to meet with him, and he would go and pick them up. But what waited for them was not the glamorous modeling world. It was a nightmarish world of motel rooms, forced sexual encounters—with Harris himself and then with paying customers—and other degrading and violent acts.

Harris used violence and intimidation to keep the girls

cooperative. He took their wallets and their cell phones, cutting off their communication with the outside world. In one instance, he deprived a victim of food for four days because he thought she wasn't serving a client well enough. He also supplied her with marijuana and alcohol. Another victim was beaten with a towel rack torn from a motel room wall when Harris found her using a phone to call her mother for help. And he helped himself to all the money paid by customers.

Using photos he took or occasionally pilfered from the victims' own social media pages, Harris advertised the girls' services on various Internet websites.

The case was investigated by the FBI's Child Exploitation Task Force in Houston, one of many child-focused task forces that we participate in around the country, working side by side with our partner agencies to investigate indi-

viduals and criminal enterprises responsible for victimizing young people. The Houston task force works closely with the Houston Police Department—in particular, its Vice and Juvenile Sex Crimes Divisions—and it was Houston uniformed officers who recov-

ered one of Harris' victims and subsequently notified the task force.

task force collected enough evidence to convince Harris to plead guilty. There was also enough evidence to prompt the judge to order (see FBI ctd. pg. 7)





In the opening verses of Exodus we find the children of Israel were prospering and their numbers were growing rapidly. The king that had dealt so graciously with Joseph and the Israelites was replaced by a new king that didn't know Joseph. When this new king observed how many Hebrews were now living and prospering in Egypt, he began to consider them a threat to the future of Egypt. He set taskmasters over the Hebrews and forced them into slavery and hard labor to keep them under his control. To eliminate future strength in numbers and fighting

the midwives feared God, and did not do as the king of Egypt commanded them, but saved the male children alive. So the king of Egypt called for the midwives and said to them, "Why have you done this thing, and saved the male children alive?" And the midwives said to Pharoah, "Because the Hebrew women are not like the Egyptian women; for they are lively and give birth before the midwives come to them."

Therefore God dealt well with the midwives, and the people multiplied and grew very mighty. And so it was, because the midwives feared God, that He provided households for them.

Ordinarily in those days, households were only established for men but God provided graciously for these two women as a result of their faithfulness to Him in a very difficult situation.

Nine medical practioners indicted in conspiracy to distribute controlled pain medication as employees of Breakthrough Pain Center of Maryville

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. - On Oct. 7, 2014, a federal grand jury in Knoxville returned a two-count indictment against two medical doctors (M.D.), two physician's assistants (P.A.) and five nurse practitioners (N.P.) for conspiring to distribute oxycodone, morphine, oxymorphone, and alprazolam, by writing prescriptions for controlled substances which were not for legitimate medical purposes. Additionally, the indictment on file with the U.S. District Court alleges that these nine individuals were also
