According to the warrants, On or about October 22, 2014, Eric Parris did commit the offense of Aggravated Assault. Eric Parris did stand guard at the rear of an apartment in McGhee Square after learning that a property manager was attempting to contact two subjects inside the apartment to bar them from the premises.

As the victim, and her boyfriend, approached the rear door they heard a male voice demand them to open the door.

The victim, believing the voice to be that of a law enforcement officer, opened the door. Upon opening the door, Eric Parris and his wife, Cameron Parris did physically force victims back into the apartment as to prevent them from leaving the residence. While inside the apartment a physical altercation continued between Cameron Parris and victim. Eric Parris did deploy a taser/stun gun and apply it to





## Cyber Security

Task Force Takes 'Whole Government' Approach

Hackers compromising banking and retail networks to steal consumers' personal information. Foreign actors virtually accessing our trade secrets. Criminal groups lining their pockets by exploiting any online vulnerability they can find.

In today's virtual world, it is well known that cyber crime can jeopardize our privacy, our economy, and even our national security. Less well known is an organization—the National Cyber Investigative Joint Task Force (NCIJTF)—that is working around the clock to fight the threat.

"The challenge we face as a nation is formidable, because the bad actors never stop trying to infiltrate our systems," said Greg McAleer, an assistant special agent in charge at the U.S. Secret Service who was recently named one of the NCI-JTF's deputy directors.

"The NCIJTF uses a whole government approach—employing every tool in our arsenal to address the threat and protect our infrastructure, financial systems, and intellectual property."

Working largely out of public view, the nearly two dozen federal intelligence, military, and law enforcement agencies that comprise the NCIJTF—along with local law enforcement tional and private industry partners—serve as the government's central hub for coordinating, integrating, and sharing information related to cyber threat investigations.

Established in 2008 by a presidential directive and administered by the FBI, the NCI-JTF is also tasked with identifying cyber hackers and understanding their motivations and capabilities. That knowledge is used to disrupt criminal operations, minimize the consequences of intrusions, and to ultimately bring perpetrators to justice.

This unified, government-wide approach leverages intelligence gathering and sharing among task force partners to gain a strategic view of what our enemies are trying to do within our infrastructure and why.

"Individual local and federal organizations rightfully focus on immediate threats in their areas of responsibility, but the NCIJTF is looking at the overall cyber landscape," said FBI Special Agent Paul Holdeman, an NCIJTF chief. "We are looking at the broad strategic shifts in the enemy's

tactics and movements. What are these bad actors doing, and what threats do they pose?"

The ability to share intelligence across agencies government integrates the response to intrusions and investigations. "That is the key to the NCIJTF's success, the exchange of information," Holdeman said. "Bringing everyone together under one roof has been a huge benefit."

agencies and interna- Gustavo Rodriguez, a lieutenant with the New York Police Department (NYPD), recently completed a sixmonth assignment on the task force as part of the FBI's Law Enforcement Fellows program, in which members of local law enforcement are trained so they can in turn train their colleagues when they return to their organizations.



The Fellows program allowed me to see the threat in real time domestically and internationally." He added, "This experience has opened my eyes to how serious the threat is and how

much damage bad actors could cause if left unchecked."

The cyber criminals and nation states probing our systems are relentless, McAleer said. "But the American public should know that the NCIJTF will leverage technology, intelligence, tactics, and partnerships to disrupt attacks before they materialize."

According to the report, Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, responded to Vonore Road for a 911 Hang up. Upon arrival Deputy made contact with victim who stated that her grandson Mr. Brian Wayne Mendenhall had chocked his girlfriend. Upon approaching the room Deputy Billy Lewis could hear victim and Mr. Mendenhall cussing and arguing back and forth.

Upon Attempting to make contact Deputy Billy Lewis could not get either subject to the door after announcing his presents several times Deputy made contact in the room and

observed Mr. Mendenhall laying in the Bed next to victim smoking and victim was crying. Upon Speaking with victim she stated to Deputy that they where playing around with a mask when a string had got removed and victim stated that Mr. Mendenhall went crazy and starting swinging the rope at her striking her in the arms resulting in red Welts being left on both Forearms. victim stated that Mr. Mendenhall then came at her and actively attempted to ripped the nose ring out of her nose stating that she screamed loudly due to the pain. Mr. Mendenhall then grabbed a pillow got on top of her placed the pillow over her face and started smothering her. vic-

tim stated that she then

screamed I Cant Breath and Mr. Mendenhall stopped and stated the mask means more to him than she does.

The victim stated that they have been together for seven years and that they have a four year old son child together whom was not present at this residence. Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, then spoke to Mr. Mendenhall who stated that yes he had done all those things to victim because he was dumb. victim stated that Mr. Mendenhall had drank about nine beers and also took his medicine for anxiety. Deputy Billy LEwis LCSO, then took Mr. Mendenhall into Custody For Aggravated Domestic Assault and transported him to the Loudon County Jail without further incident.

two young children, and he streamed and attempted to stream live video of this abuse and exploitation to others. Because he streamed his child pornography via webcam, we had no images or videos to enter as evidence. However, we managed to track down a number of people Beckman streamed to—and two of them testified

against him in court. One of those two individuals was charged, pled guilty, and was sentenced to a 12-year prison term. Charges are pending against the second.

After a two-week trial during which one of the young victims testified against Beckman from a room outside the courtroom, a jury found the defendant guilty on 15 of the 16 charges against him.





