someone today, even if they are not on your Christmas card list, lend them a hand and let God be honored by the way you conduct yourself.

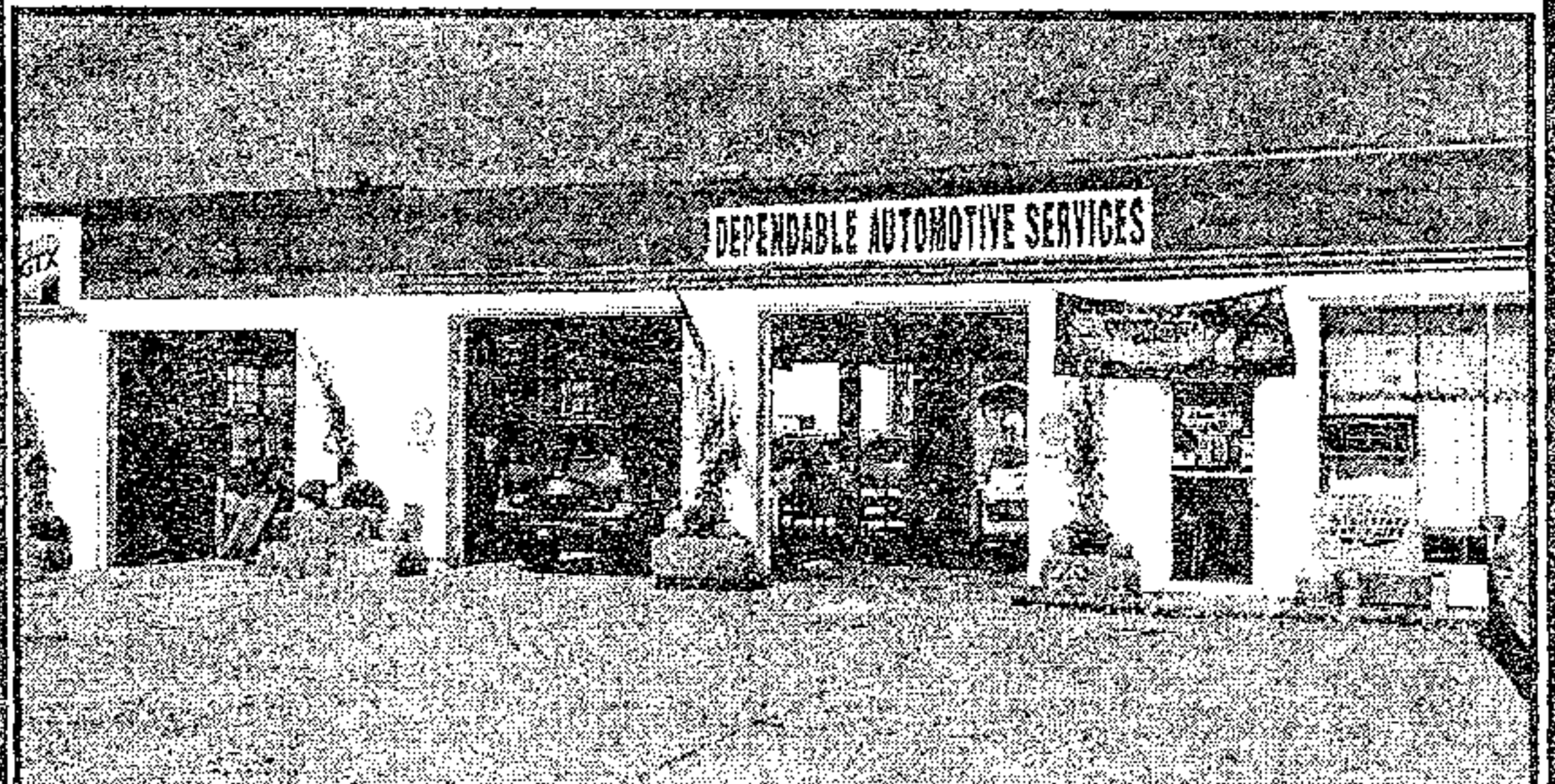
If I have learned anything at all since giving Christ the reigns of my life it is simply this: Every decision I make matters to Jesus! Think
