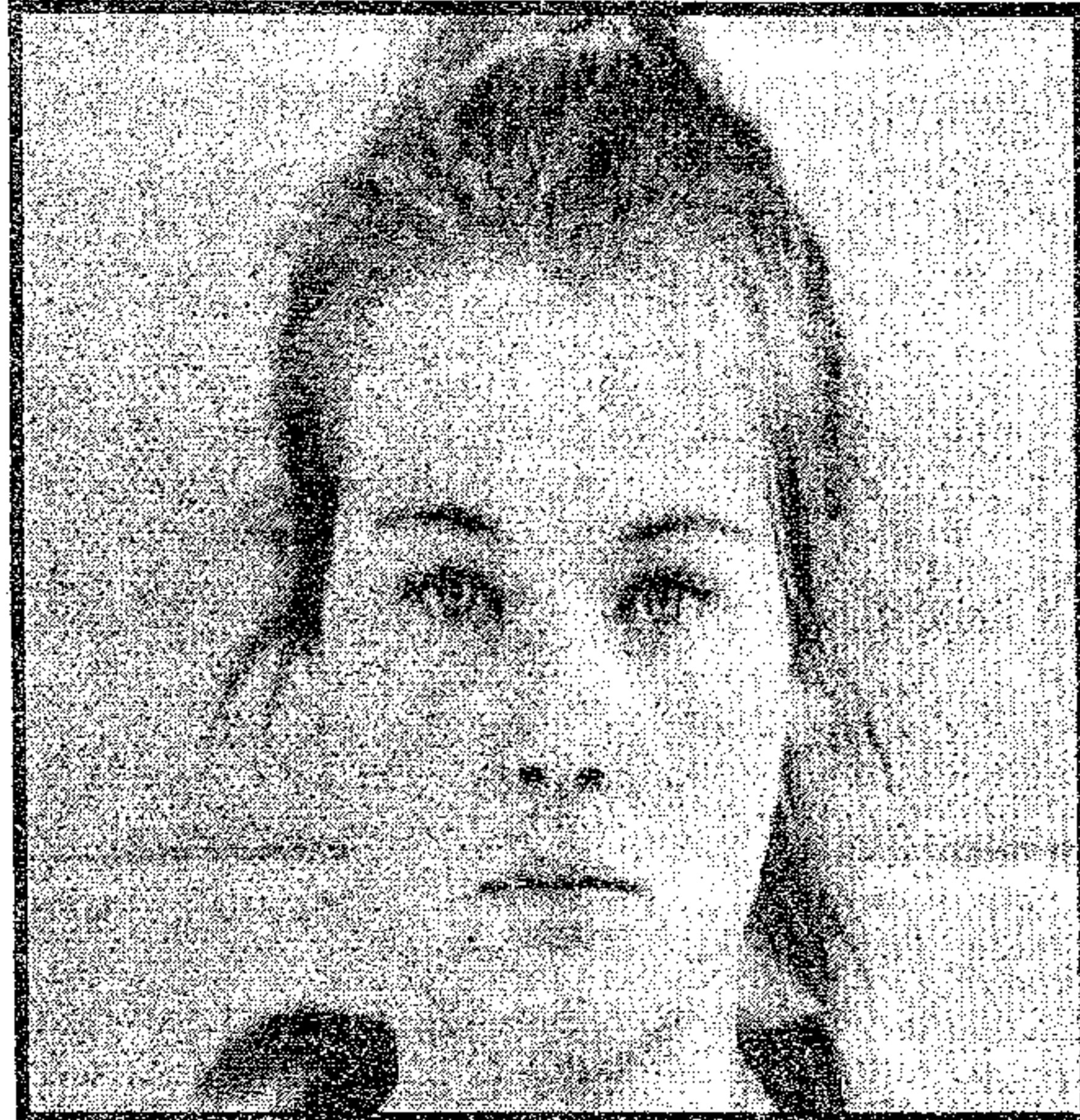

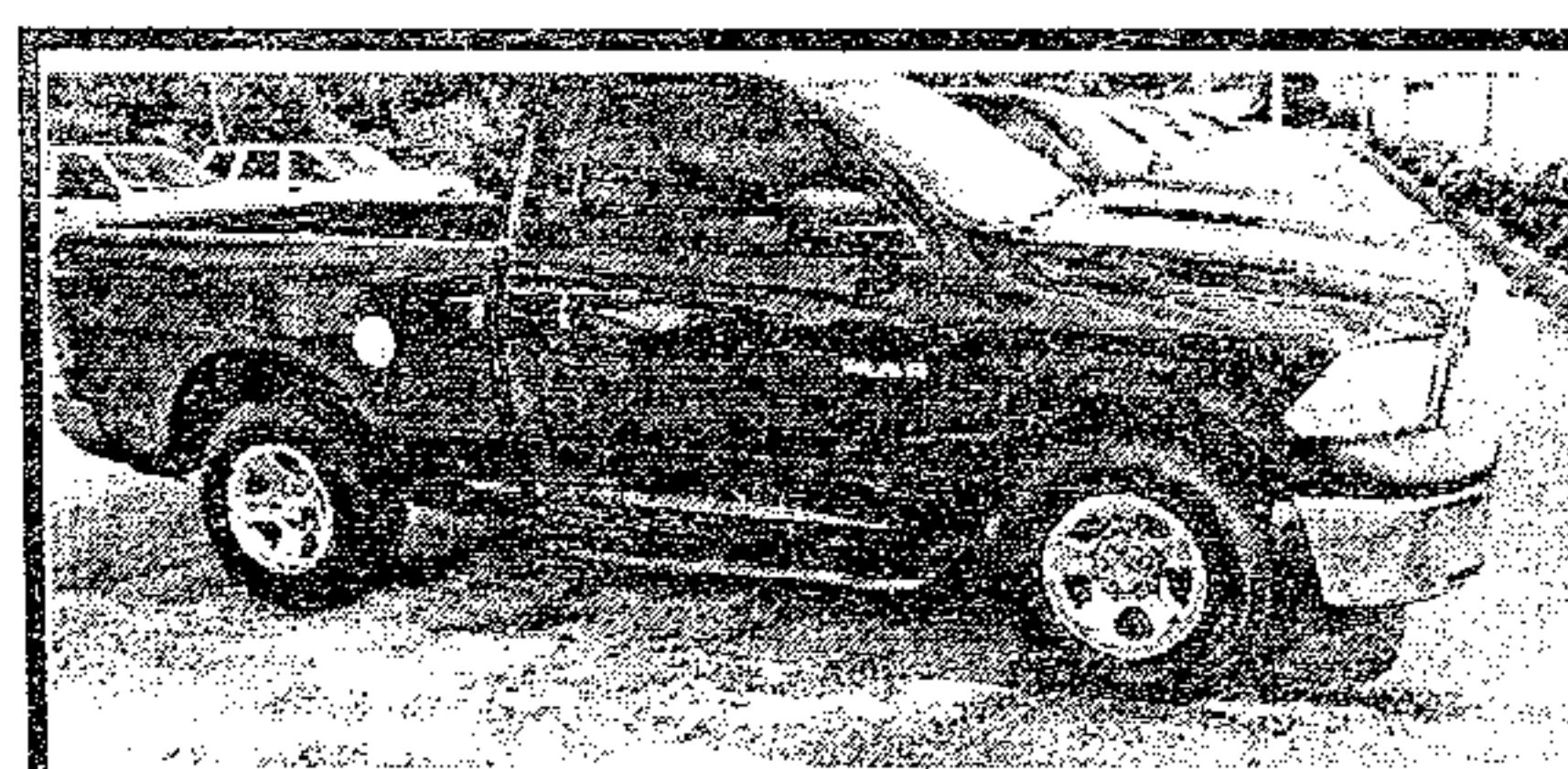

Deidra Hammons, 22, Evans Lane Lenoir City, was charged with Poss. of Drug Para.

Dylan Hammons, 21, Robinson Road Loudon, was charged with Contraband in Penal Institution, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Brian Smith LCSO, did observe a blue Ford Mustang traveling west on Highway 72 in Loudon County and crossed the center divider line twice and crossed the fog line once. Upon stopping the vehicle Deputy found the driver to be Mr. Dylan Kendall Hammons and found the front passenger to be Ms. Diedra Diniel Hammons. Deputy did notice Mr. Hammons was very slow to react to questions and seemed to have slurred speech.
