being executed on two separate occasions, on Mar. 21, 2012, and on Oct. 17, 2012. In both instances, agents recovered extensive amounts of Schedule I controlled substances and Schedule I controlled substance analogues. Most of these drugs were already prepackaged for resale. Numerous firearms were also recovered.

This long term investigation was the product of a partnership between the Bristol, Tennessee Police Department, Second Judicial District Drug Task Force, Sullivan County Sherriff's Office, and the Drug Enforcement Administration. Assistant U.S. Attorney Nick Regalia represented the United States.

The investigation is a result of the Department of Justice's Organized Crime and Drug Enforcement Task Force (OCDETF) program, the centerpiece of the Department of Justice's drug supply reduction OCDETF strategy. was established in 1982 to conduct comprehensive, multi-level attacks on major drug trafficking and money laundering organizations.

Today, OCDETF combines the resources and expertise of its member federal agencies in cooperation with state and local law enforcement.

The principal mission of the OCDETF program is to identify, disrupt, and dismantle the most serious drug trafficking and money laundering organizations and those primarily responsible for the nation's drug supply. Police Beat
