Dennis Mullins, 50, Puncheon Road KY, was charged with DUI, Reckless Driving, Legend Drug, and Poss. of SCH. IV Drug.

Jimmy Thomas, 38, Arnold Fork Road KY, was charged Public Intoxication, with Poss. of Drug Para., Legend Drug, and Poss. of SCH. IV.

According to the reports, Deputy Lance Anderson LCSO, observed a red Ford Explorer bearing a Kentucky registration on Interstate 75 North, swerving with in the right lane, slowing down, and speeding up. Deputy observed the vehicle cross over into the left lane nearly striking another vehicle on two occasions. Deputy conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle at the 80 mile marker. Deputy made contact with the driver, Dennis Ray Mullins, and the front right passenger Jimmy Ray Thomas. Deputy observed both offenders had extremely constricted pupils and neither offender's pupils reacted to bright light. Deputy asked the driver out of the vehicle to conduct an interview for safety reasons due to traffic and observing pistol ammunition in the glove box. Deputy asked the driver if he would perform the standardized field sobriety tests. The driver agreed to do HGN but

would not perform the rest of the tests citing a past broken neck injury in 1982 and other medical conditions. The driver performed poorly on HGN. Deputy also observed a white power substance in the driver's right nostril. Based on the totality of circumstance the driver was placed under arrest for DUI and read the implied consent advisement. The driver agreed to give a blood sample.

Deputy then made contact with the passenger who appeared to under the influence of some medication or narcotic. Deputy asked the passenger out of the vehicle and to the front of my cruiser and as he was getting out of the vehicle Deputy noticed a empty green prescription bottle and a small metallic object in the passenger door. The metallic object was later confirmed to be a mechanical weighting





and two peach colored pills tentatively identified as Clonazapam which is a schedule 4 narcotic that Mcknight did not have a prescription for. There was also a yellow oblonged pill identified as Hydrocodone which Mcknight had no prescription for. In the same case was a set of digital scales and a hypodermic syringe. Mr. McKnight was transported to the Loudon County Jail without any further incident.Detective Brian Jenkins LPD, made the arrest.
