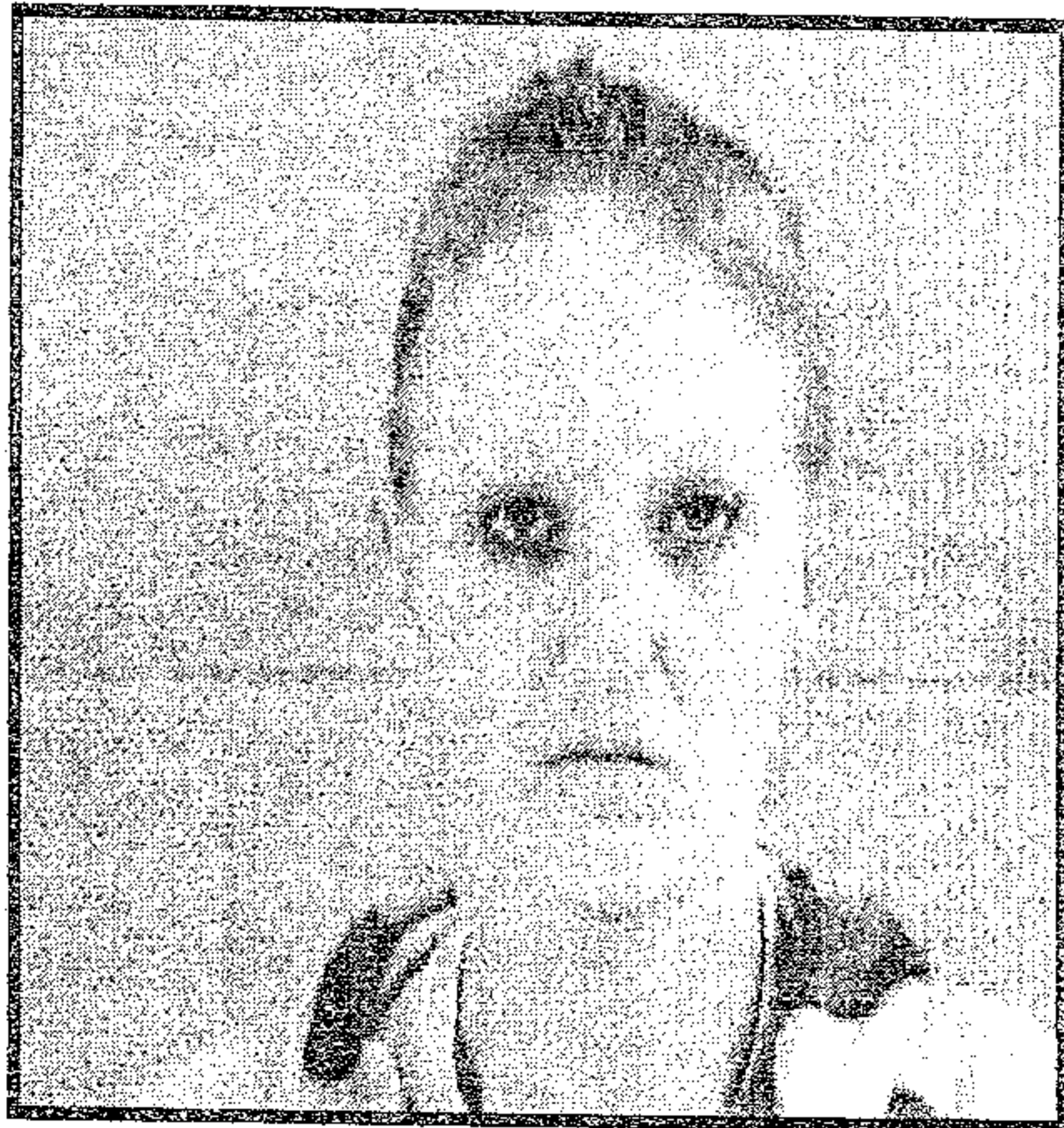

Latest Hate Crime Statistics Report Released

Publication Includes New Data Collected Under Shepard/Byrd Act as a whole.

Today, the FBI released its annual Hate Crime Statistics report, which revealed that 5,928 hate crime incidents involving 6,933 offenses were reported by our law enforcement partners to the Bureau's Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) Program in 2013. These hate crime incidents impacted a total of 7,242 victims—which are defined as individuals, businesses, institutions, or society

The number of reported hate crimes last year is down slightly when compared to 2012 UCR figures—5,928 in 2013 versus the 2012 figure of 6,573 (a combination of the 5,796 incidents in Hate Crime Statistics, 2012 and the 777 additional incidents published in Hate Crime Addendum, 2012).

the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr. Hate Crime Prevention Act of 2009—has a few changes from previous reports. First, biases against gender (male or female) and gender identity (transgender and gender nonconformity) have been added to the list of bias categories. And in response to the Shepard/Byrd Act, we modified our data collection so that reporting agencies can indicate whether crimes were committed by, or directed against, juveniles.

Recent Investigative Successes Against Hate Crime Perpetrators

The investigation of hate crimes remains a top priority of the FBI's civil rights program. We investigate hate crimes that fall under federal jurisdiction, can assist state and local authorities during their own investigations, and in some cases—with the U.S. Department of Justice Civil Rights Division—monitor developing situations to determine if federal action is appropriate. Here are several

examples of cases we've recently investigated:

- In November 2014, a Texas man was sentenced to 15 years in prison for luring a young gay man to his home and brutally assaulting him because of his sexual orientation. Details

- In September 2014, a former member of the Ku Klux Klan pleaded guilty for his role in a cross burning in front of an interracial family's home in Tennessee. Details

- Also in September 2014, a Utah man pleaded guilty to interfering with the housing rights of three members of an interracial family by threatening to kill them if they did not make their African-American family member leave their home. Details

- In July 2014, four individuals were indicted for their alleged roles in a racially

Deputy JC Schultz LCSO, pulled into the TA truckstop at North Watt Rd to assist Deputy B. Hamilton LCSO. Deputy Hamilton had a black 1994 Nissan Maxima stopped due to suspicious activity. The vehicle was driving around the parking lot and parking in several locations, while the occupants appeared to be nervous and trying to observe the travel store.

The Driver of said vehicle was Mr Trey C. Brown and the passenger was Ms Amy I. Fair, both individuals stated that they had payed two hundred dollars for the vehicle and were taking over the rest of the payments from a person. A subsequent search of his person found a Glass pipe with residue inside a shoot kit (two syringes, filters, water, tourniquet), and three lighters. Mr Browns vehicle was inventoried prior to being towed by Moneymakers Wrecker Service. Inside the ve-

hicle was one gram of schedule II methamphetamine, a set of scales, a small baggie with a quantity of plastic bags, two more Glass pipes, a spoon with residue on it, a shoot kit in a black leather case with tourniquet, two needles, water pliers for crushing, and a blowtorch were found.

Investigator Marty Stanley LCSO Narcotics, Mirandized both subjects and after being Mirandized both subjects separately admitted to purchasing the methamphetamine jointly. They also admitted to owning the paraphernalia together. A seizure hold was placed on the vehicle with Moneymakers Wrecker. Both subjects were arrested on scene and transported to the Loudon County Jail by Deputy JC. Schultz LCSO.






