If convicted, each faces a prison term of at least 10 years and up to life, a term of supervised release of at least 5 years and up to life, a fine of up to

\$10,000,000, any applicable forfeiture, and a \$100 special assessment.

The indictment and supporting documentation are on file with the U.S. District Court in Knoxville, alleges that the conspiracy occurred between January and December 2014.
