Tyler Barr, 24, Washington Pike Philadelphia, was charged with DUI.

According to the report, On 12-20-2014 at approximately 05:30am, Deputy Jamie Ketner LCSO, was patrolling in the area of Corinth Church Rd. Deputy noticed a silver 2007 Dodge Ram 2500 pick up truck in a field,

of an alcoholic beverage about his person and red, watery, bloodshot eyes. The driver presented a Tennessee OLN, at Deputy request and was identified as David Morgan Turrentine, JR.. Deputy explained to Turrentine that he had stopped him for the two stop sign violations and he shook his head in agreement. Deputy visually observed 7 open beer cans of Coors Light, Rolling Rock and Natural Light. The 7 open cans were directly behind the

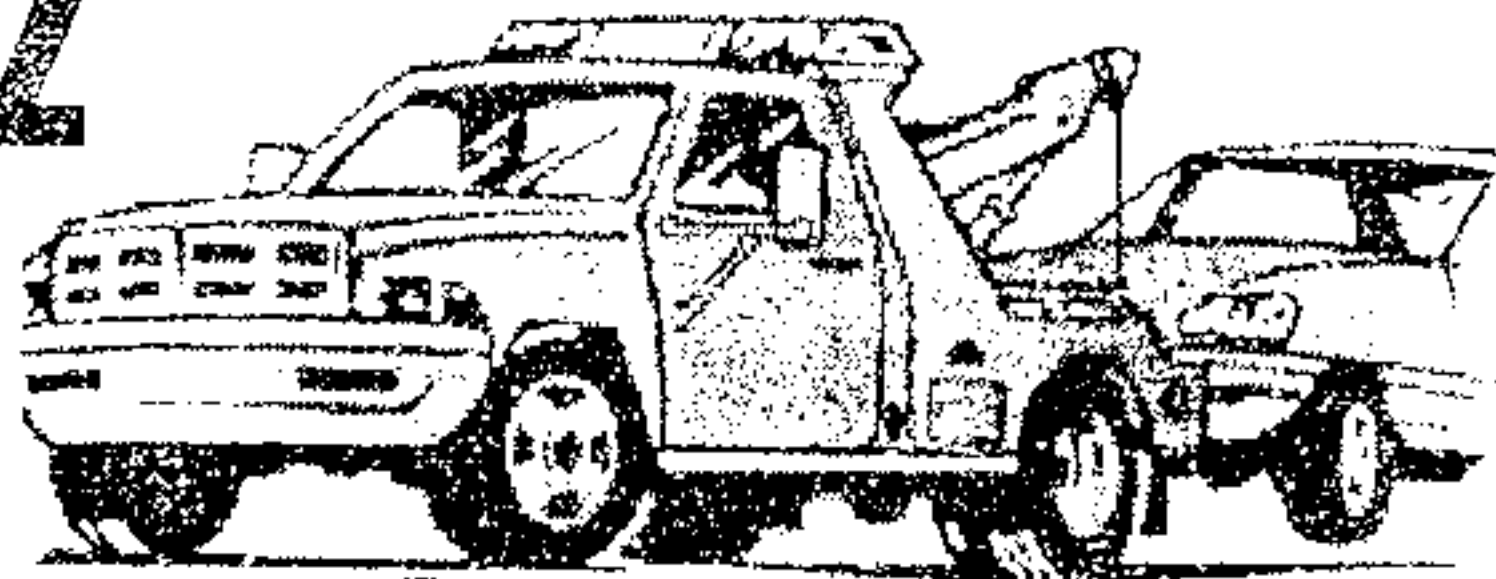

Jones kicked Deputy in the left knee on multiple occasions and attempted to gain control of Deputy by grabbing his tie, Deputy did placed Jones in a wrist lock, using soft empty hand techniques, and take custody of Jones. Jones did have on him a small bag of a green leafy substance, believed to be marijuana, inside of his pants. Jones did also have a marijuana pipe in his pants in his left leg, as well as tin foil in his right pants pocket, Deputy did ask Jones if he had anything else illegal on him to which he stated "no". After transporting Jones to the jail, Deputy did advise Jones that if he did have anything illegal he needed to declare it prior to walking to the jail.
