The Request for Blanket Exemption was presented at the State Funding Board meeting held on November 21, 2014. The Board requested that the Request be subject to public comment through December 12, 2014. The Comptroller will present the comments to the Board for further review and consideration at its meeting on December 16, 2014.

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 5 of Public Chapter 766, Acts of 2014 (effective July 1, 2014), a local government or local government instrumentality must first obtain from the Comptroller approval of the issuance of balloon indebtedness. The State Funding Board guidelines with respect to Comptroller approval of balloon indebtedness were considered at its meeting on June 18, 2014, and were made effective July

private companies to prevent WMD attacks. In making the rounds, the coordinators share prevailing threats and become key points of contact when a suspicious incident arises in the WMD arena.

"Our WMD coordinators are the face of the Bureau when they go out and meet the locals," said Chris Freeze, assistant special agent in charge of the Houston Division, who participated in the exercise.

Bruce Shelton, the facility manager, had never dealt with most of the individuals or agencies that participated in the exercise. Seeing the response unfold in front of him gave him a fresh perspective on his own role in securing his site

and helping in a coordinated response.

"There are a lot of resources out there that I haven't used until now," he said after the scenario concluded. 'It's good to know where they're at and who they are."
