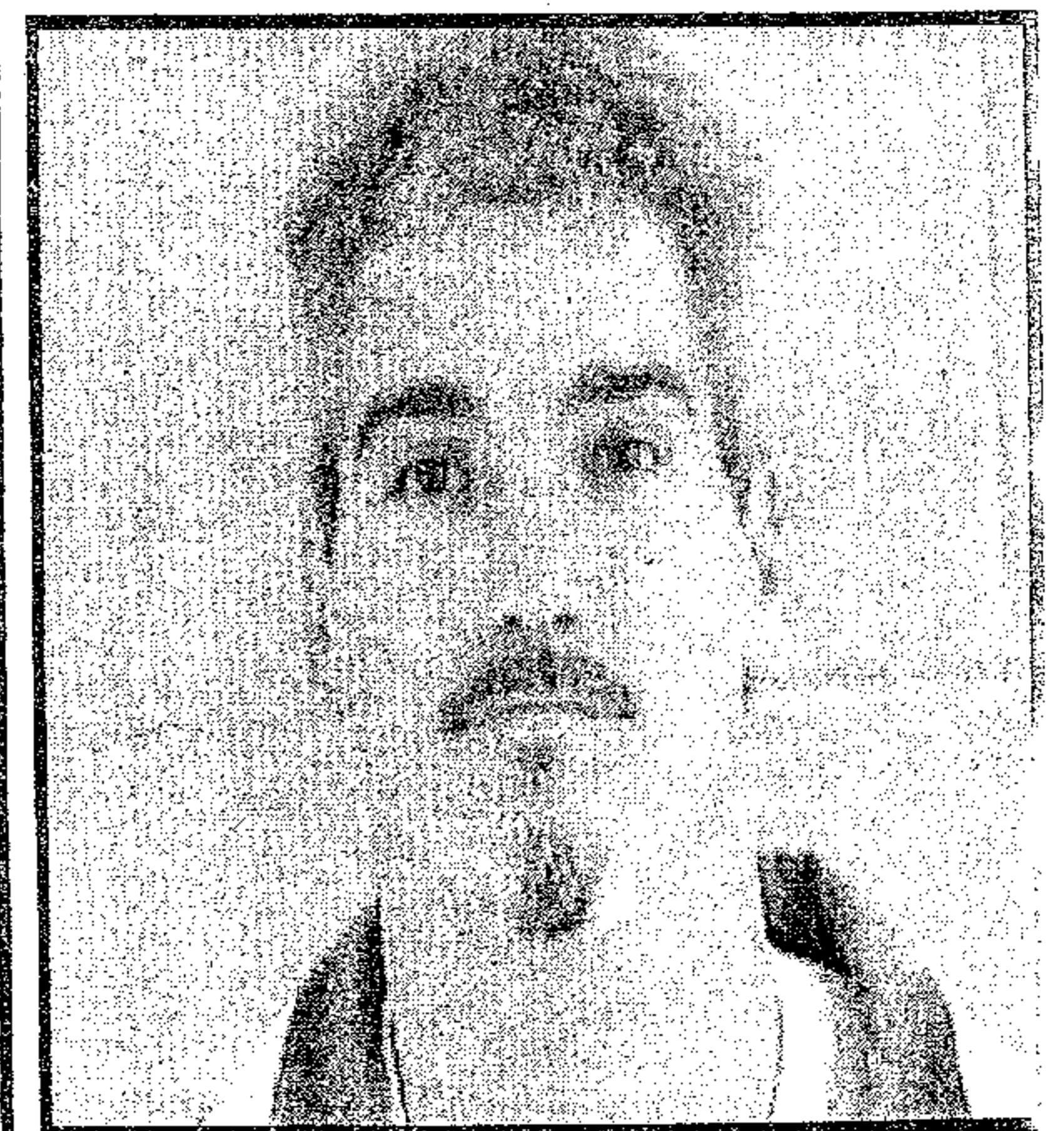

with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known to God" (verses 6-7). The basis of the sermon was getting rid of worry. I've never been one to worry much. I'm pretty easy going and just enjoy life as it happens. I've even gone as far to wonder why people even worry with worrying in the first place. However, the past couple of months have brought some unexpected changes and demands in our lives that I allowed to evolve into worry.

The preacher hit on a few key points that I want to share with you. First of all, there are two truths about worry:

- Worry is not natural – it is a learned behavior. Think back to when you were a kid. We never worried if our parents had money to make the house payment, buy groceries or even if it was burdensome for them to make it to our ballgames on time. Even if I wanted something and Mamaw said that she didn't have the money, I said, "Just write a check"! Worry was not a natural instinct. It is a habit that I have developed.

- So many times we focus on the "When and Then" theory – "when" I get through this, "then" things will be easier. "When" I get

a better job, "then" I will be happy.

So, how do we "un-learn" this unnatural habit that consumes so much of our thoughts, time and joy?

- Use the time we spend in worry in prayer.

- Think about the right things. We can control what consumes our minds. We may have to change some of the things that we allow in our brains to begin with (such as tv, inappropriate conversations, and negativity in general). I remember when we surrendered to God that we quit listening to nasty music and cut out some inappropriate tv shows. We were (and still are) firm believers in "bad stuff in – bad stuff out". The more we allow unhealthy things in our

lives, the healthier our lives become. If we can continually seek to have the mindset found in Philippians 4:8-9, we can remove worry and have the joy through Jesus – "Finally brothers, whatever is true, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable – if there is any moral excellence and if there is any praise – dwell on these things. Do what you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you."

These verses are in my thoughts and prayers for those (including me) who have allowed worry in their lives. If we will apply these Biblical commands, we can transform those old habits into joyous attitudes with gratitude!

The back passenger in the vehicle was identified as Mark Walker. Ms. McKiddy and Mr. Walker are in a relationship and Mr. Walker is currently on the meth registry for promoting the manufacturing of methamphetamine out of Monroe County on 8/19/2013. Ms. McKiddy stated to officer's that she purchased the pseudoephedrine product for Mr. Walker because he is unable to purchase it and that it was going to be used by Mr. Walker for the purpose of man-

ufacturing methamphetamine. McKiddy states that she has purchased approximately 3 or 4 times in the last 4 months for Mr. Walker. Upon further searching the vehicle there was located in the rear floorboard a bottle of brake fluid and a pack of coffee filters. All items located are

used in the process of manufacturing methamphetamine. Officer April Farmer LPD DTF, made the arrest.
