that challenge has completely changed everything about my life and my relationship with Christ.

My prayer life once consisted of an occasional "shout out" to God before a meal or when I wanted God to give me something, do something or fix something that I had done wrong. As I began to replace my wish list of wants with a time of worship and praise, followed by a time of seeking the guidance and direction of God, I began to grow as a Christian man and the spiritual leader of my home. I have since witnessed God answering specific prayers and leading me into situations that only He could have orchestrated.

My giving could once be compared to that .50 cents we all drop into the Salvation Army can at Christmas time because it's cold and we feel sorry for the poor bell ringer who has made eye contact with us as we leave the store. At church I would occasionally throw a five dollar bill into the offering plate after folding it so that it might look like a twenty to the usher as he collected God's money. Be honest, many of you are guilty of the same! As Angie and I began to give back to God from the abundance of what He has given us, we quickly discovered that we could not out give God. The more we gave to our church, to those around us in need and to missionaries serving around the world, the more God provided for our needs and even our desires.

Within six months of making a solid commitment to honor God with

our time, talents and resources, Angie and I were on a plane heading to a small village in Guatemala where our lives were forever changed! We left New Providence with about fifteen others from our church family all carrying bags full of children's shoes. Before arriving to San Mateo I had never witnessed a child with dirty black feet that had never owned a pair of shoes. I hadn't looked into the eyes of a mother who was raising a family in a wood shed with dirt floors and a campfire for a kitchen. I left Guatemala that week a different person than when I arrived. I felt guilty for having so much, wasting so much and investing so little in real life people lacking basic resources that we so often take for granted.

After that first mission trip to Guatemala, no, even before the trip, God placed a desire in Angie's and my heart

for people, and for missions, and for God. We grew closer to the Lord through that experience and each missionary journey since only drew us even closer and fueled our desire to do more. Now here we are, three years later, serving as missionaries to Helena, Montana and sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with those God places in our path. GOING truly leads to growing.

So today I challenge YOU to consider PRAYING, GIVING AND GOING. Pray to the Creator and Healer of the universe. Give Him praise for being God and being in control. Give as God has given to you. Support your church with more than a folded five dollar bill, help those around you in need and maybe even consider supporting a missionary serving in another context. (I just happen to know a couple!) I also encourage you to GO. Consider a short term

missionary journey to a location outside of your community. Angie and I have discovered that each time we planned to encourage others on mission, we were always the ones drawn closer to God.

Have you ever sacrificed a little time, a little money and a few days labor to invest in others that you may never see again? What if such an opportunity were readily available, very affordable and others from your area were also planning to go?

Angie and I are very excited about partner-

ing with the Loudon County Baptist Association this summer for a one week mission trip to assist a local church and community within five miles of our home here in Helena, Montana, and we would like to invite you to get involved.

The trip will leave Loudon County on Saturday, June 21st and return the following Saturday, June 28th, 2014. Phil Holmes, the Director of Missions for the LCBA, will be leading a team of Christians to assist Blondie and me in numerous projects

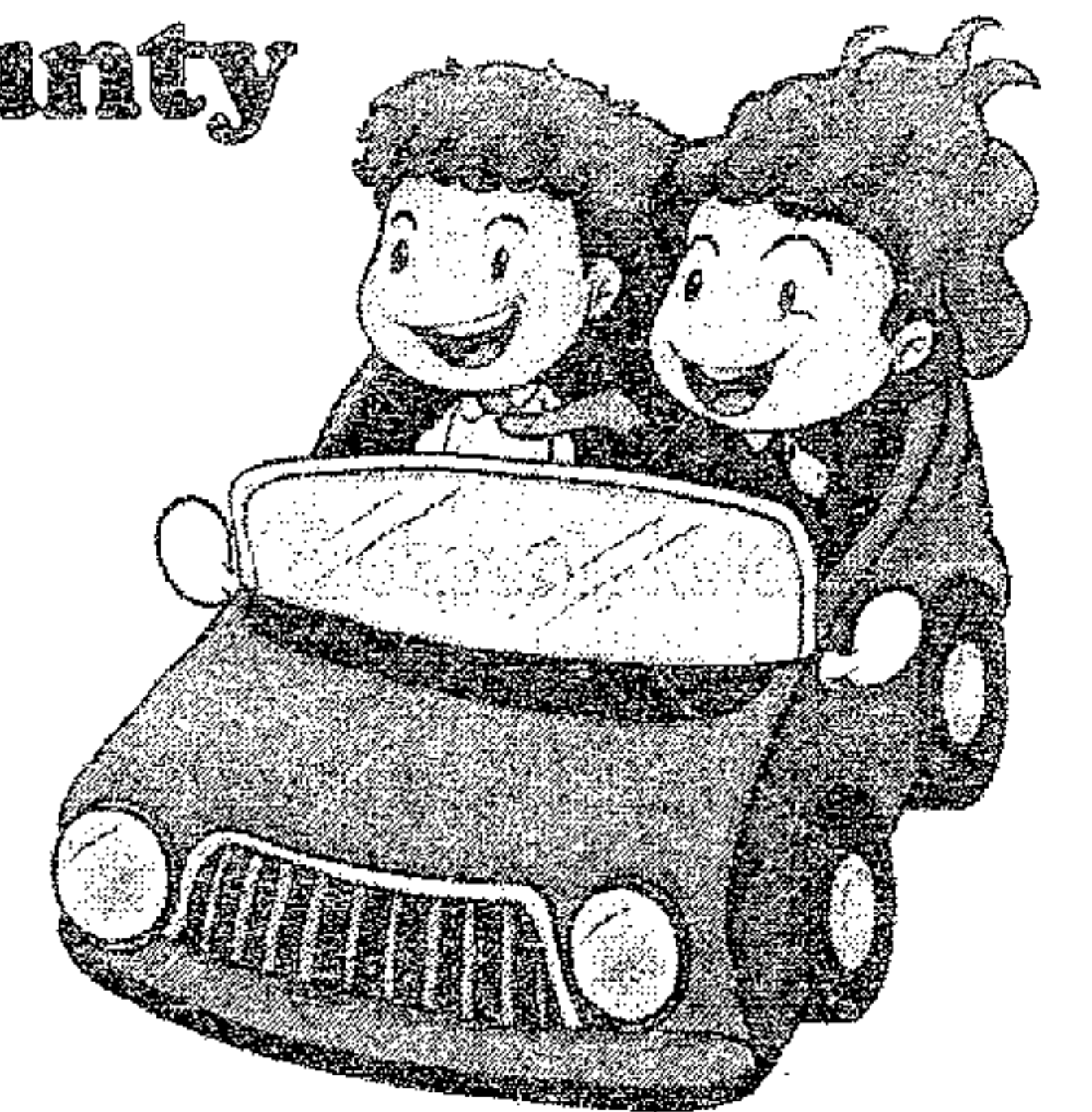
