her to the Loudon County Jail. At the jail I did read a copy of the implied consent law and Mrs. Dixon did consent to a breath test. Sgt. Bowen did wait the allotted 20 min and she did blow a .16. Sgt. Jeramie Bowen LCSO made the arrest.

Burglary



Meth

On February 7, 2014, at approximately 3:30 AM, a Loudon County Sheriff's Deputy noticed a Dodge Challenger cross the fog line several times while traveling south on Interstate 75 in Loudon County. The vehicle exited at Exit 76 and the officer initiated a traffic stop at the intersections of Sugar Limb Road and Hotchkiss Valley

Road. He made contact with the driver, identified as Jennifer Leigh Kendrick, age 30, of Covington, GA. Ms. Kendrick stated to the officer she was having a medical emergency. An ambulance was dispatched to the location and cleared the driver medically. Ms. Kendrick was then asked to perform a field sobriety test due to being very lethargic and unsteady on her feet. She agreed to the tests and could not complete any of them, telling the Deputy she had taken methamphetamine. K-9 Dante was

deployed to check the outside of the car did alert to an odor of illegal narcotics. Mrs. Kendrick admitted to methamphetamine being in the vehicle. Upon field testing the package it was determined that there was a one pound package of methamphetamine inside the vehicle. Kendrick was then arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail.

An additional search of the vehicle also found two loaded handguns, to which Ms. Kendrick admitted stealing, and a set of digital scales in the trunk. Kendrick is currently being held under a total of \$77,000 bond in the Loudon County Jail.

According to report on 1/20/14 Cierra was observed by Walmart loss prevention a male select merchandise, and then handed the merchandise to Cierra who refunded merchandise for a gift card for \$80.52. 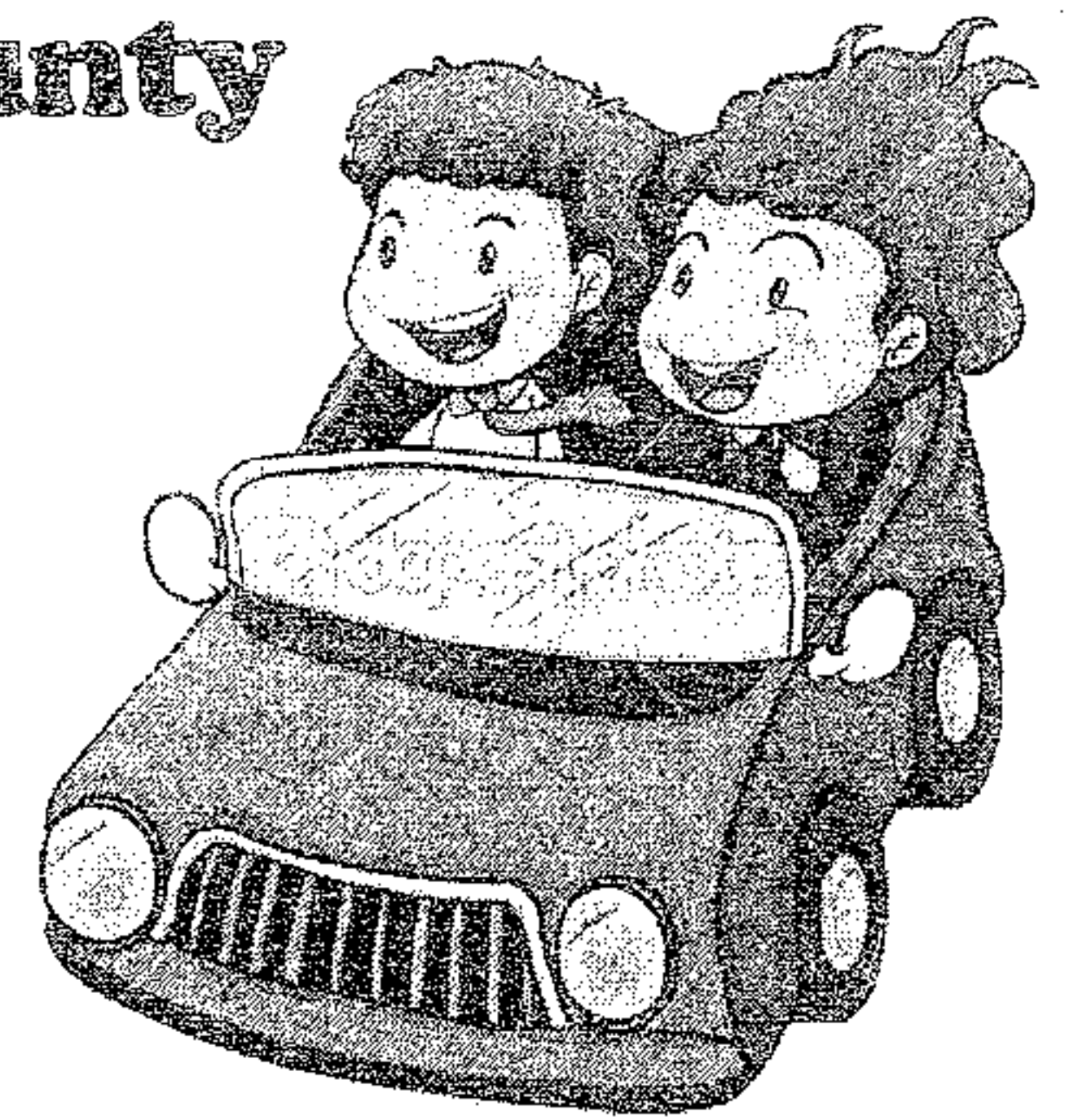

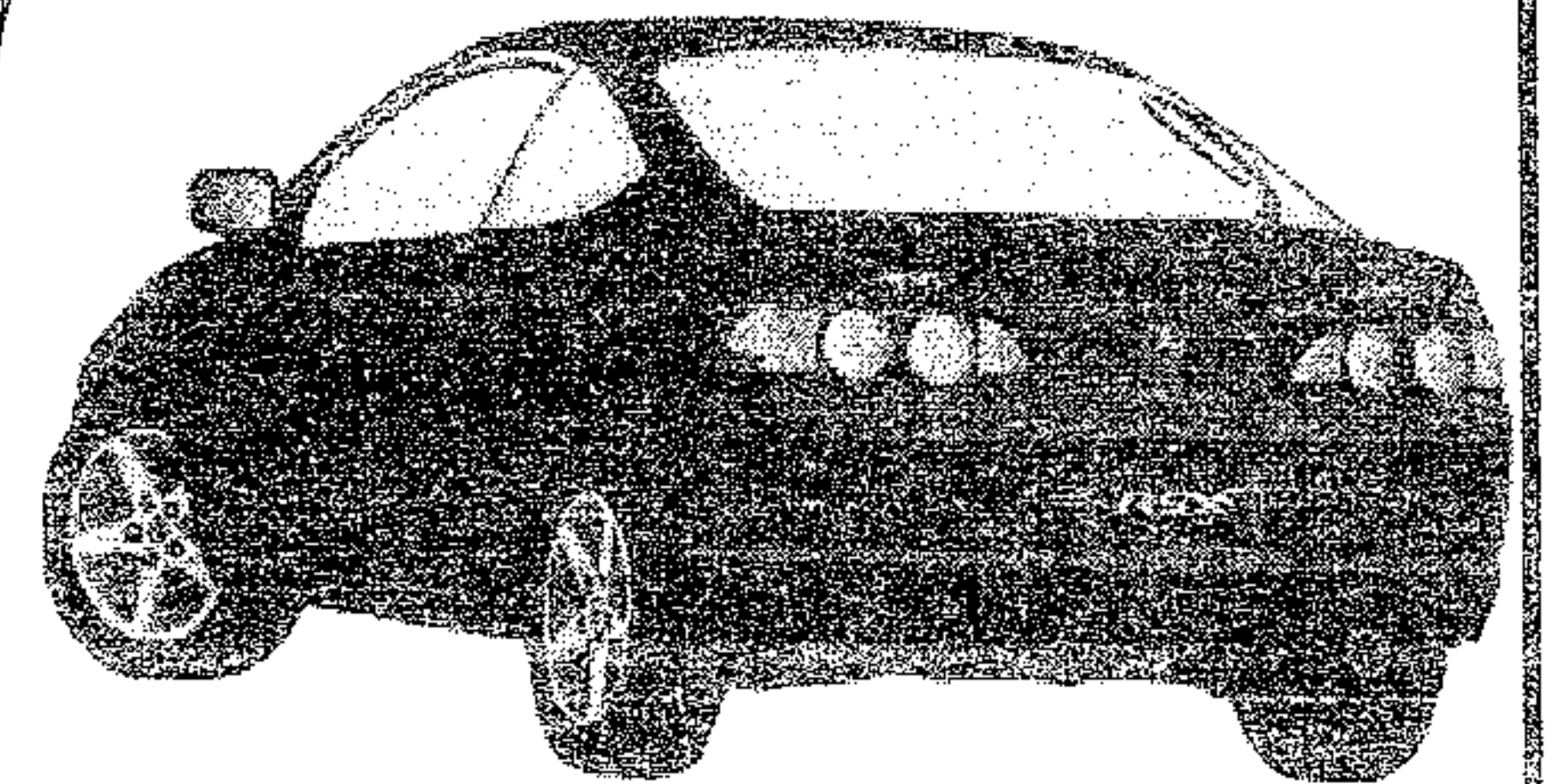

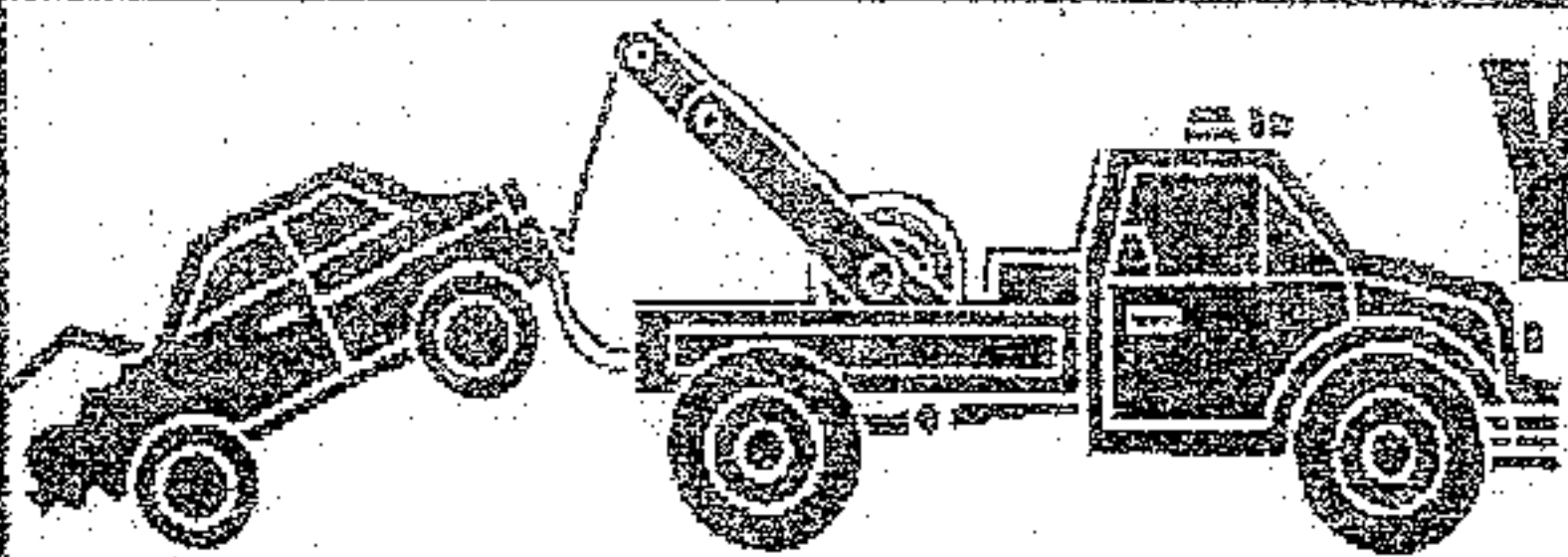

Anthony Suggs, 38, Eula Private Drive Bristol, was charged with DUI, Poss. Of a handgun while under the influence, Violation of implied consent, Violation of order of protection, and Driving without a valid license.

According to the report, Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO was dispatched to a reckless driver on I75. Dispatch

advised that they had about 4 to 5 callers on the same vehicle driving reckless. Deputy Palmer did observe the vehicle pull back onto the Interstate near the 77 mile marker. Deputy Palmer observed the vehicle weaving inside the lane. Deputy also observed the vehicle cross the fog line twice then cross the lane and cross the center line. Deputy observed the vehicle straddle the center line and then

weave back into the right lane.

Deputy Palmer did activate his lights and siren to stop the vehicle. The vehicle took close to a minute to come to a stop. Deputy did make contact with the driver Mr. Anthony Liston Suggs. Deputy did observe Mr. Suggs did have red water eyes and a slurred speech. Deputy asked Mr. Suggs if he had his driver's license. Mr. Suggs stated that he did not have his driver's license. While speaking with Mr. Suggs Deputy could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from the vehicle. Deputy palmer observed a 12 pack of bud light box and several bud light bottles laying in the passenger floor board. Deputy asked Mr. Suggs if he had any weapons inside the vehicle at which time he stated no. Deputy asked Mr. Suggs to

exit the vehicle because Deputy observed a large knife laying in the passenger seat.

When Mr. Suggs exited the vehicle Deputy palmer could smell a strong odor of an alcoholic beverage emitting from his person. Deputy observed Mr. Suggs appeared to be unsteady on his feet putting his hand on the vehicle to balance himself. Deputy Palmer asked Mr. Suggs how much he had to drink at which time he stated two. Mr. Suggs did perform poorly on all standardized field sobriety test. Deputy Palmer did run Mr. Suggs thought dispatch by name and date of birth at which time they advised he did not have a license. Deputy Palmer did place Mr. Suggs under arrest for driving under the influence and driving without a license. Mr. Suggs was read the Tennessee implied consent form at

which time he stated he would give blood. While doing inventory of the vehicle Deputy found a Taurus 45 handgun inside a backpack laying in the front seat of the vehicle. Deputy also observed a black face mask inside the back pack as well. Deputy was advised by dispatch that Mr. Suggs had a order of protection that stated he was not allowed to possess or purchase a firearm.

Mr. Suggs Vehicle was towed by Malone's Wrecker Service. Deputy Palmer transported Mr. Suggs to the Fort Loudon Emergency Room to draw blood at which time Mr. Suggs would not sign the medical forms. Mr. Suggs was then transported to the Loudon County Jail

After further investigation it was determined Mr. Suggs was a convicted felon. Deputy Kenneth Palmer LCSO made the arrest.







