fumbled excessively while locating documents, and was emotionally unstable. Allbritton did admit to having a 16 ounce beer less than one hour prior to having law enforcement contact as well. When Deputy Burley asked Allbritton to exit the vehicle, Allbritton had difficulty ensuring the vehicle was in park as well as exiting the vehicle.
