The one call you never want to hear came across the radio, officer down. That was the day Deputy Jason Scott, badge number 910, was killed in the line of duty. "He forever will be remembered" stated Sheriff Tim Guider at the service.

"There is evidence all over this department of Deputy Jason Scott, he is in the hallways and even on the door on the way into the upper part of the building."

Jason's sister and mother planted a dogwood tree in remebrance Jason. Investigator Jason Smith shared stories with the crowd of those close to Jason who gave some insight into just who Jason truly was. Jason was a young man who gave his all for what he truly loved to do, be a deputy. He smiled, joked, laughed and sincerely enjoyed his job and his family.

Sheriff Guider was very emotional during the entire service as was echoed by those in attendance. Stories of "where we were" that morning were shared amongst those in the crowd as well.


The memorial with Deputy Scott's name stands as a permanent reminder of those who have died in the line of duty to keep us safe.

The service was capped off by the Loudon County Sheriff's Department Honor


Guard, who gave a 21 gun salute.
