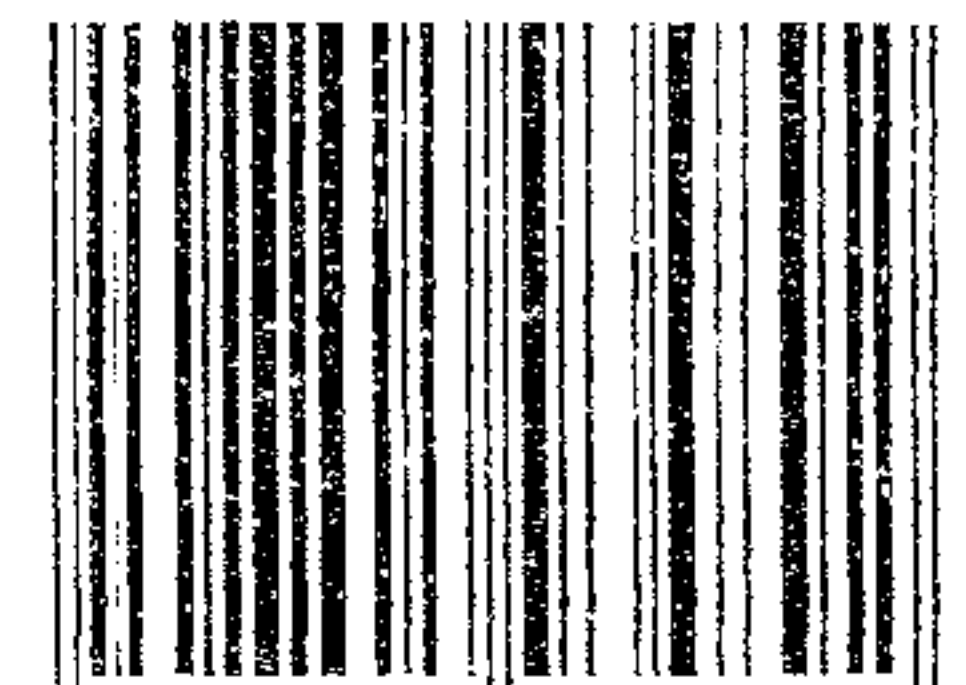

Pills

Jeffrey Dorsey, 32, Prater Road Louisville, was charged with Poss. of SCH. II, and Poss. of Drug Para.

Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, observed the above vehicle traveling on HWY 321, on the Canal Bridge, going towards Lenoir City. Deputy's in vehicle radar did first register the vehicle's speed at 55 mph in a 40 mph zone and then Deputy rear antenna registered the vehicle accelerate 59 mph in a 40 mph zone. Deputy initiated a traffic stop on the vehicle at Hwy 11 in the Jet's Pizza parking

lot. The driver of the vehicle was identified as Mr. Jeffrey Dorsey. Mr. Dorsey stated that he and his passenger were on their way to see a friend in Chattanooga.

Deputy asked Mr. Dorsey to exit the vehicle so Deputy could deploy my K9 partner, and upon pat down for weapons a pill bottle was felt in Mr. Dorsey's pocket.

Deputy asked him what it was and he stated that it was Morphine and oxycodone. Deputy asked if he could remove it and he stated that Deputy could. Upon inspection of the bottle it was found that there was 25 small red pills Marked with M30 that were the morphine tablets, and were the pills that belonged to the prescription bottle. There was also 9 white round pills in the bottle marked with m30 as well identified as oxycodone that

did not belong in the bottle. The morphine was filled on 03/20/2014 with 60 pills and there were only 25 pills left a day and a half later.

Mr. Dorsey was placed under arrest for possession of the Schedule II. During an

inventory of the vehicle a pill grinder was found in the center console with a white powdery residue found inside it. Mr. Dorsey was transported to the Loudon County Jail. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.
