The cooks are priority targets in the investigation and based on statements given by Cable he exclusively buys from them. Cable has purchased a pseudoephedrine based products or immedi-

ate meth precursor on 45 occasions primarily at the Rite-Aid. James Cable was placed under arrest. Agent Brendan DeBoer DTF, made the arrest.


Theft of property


