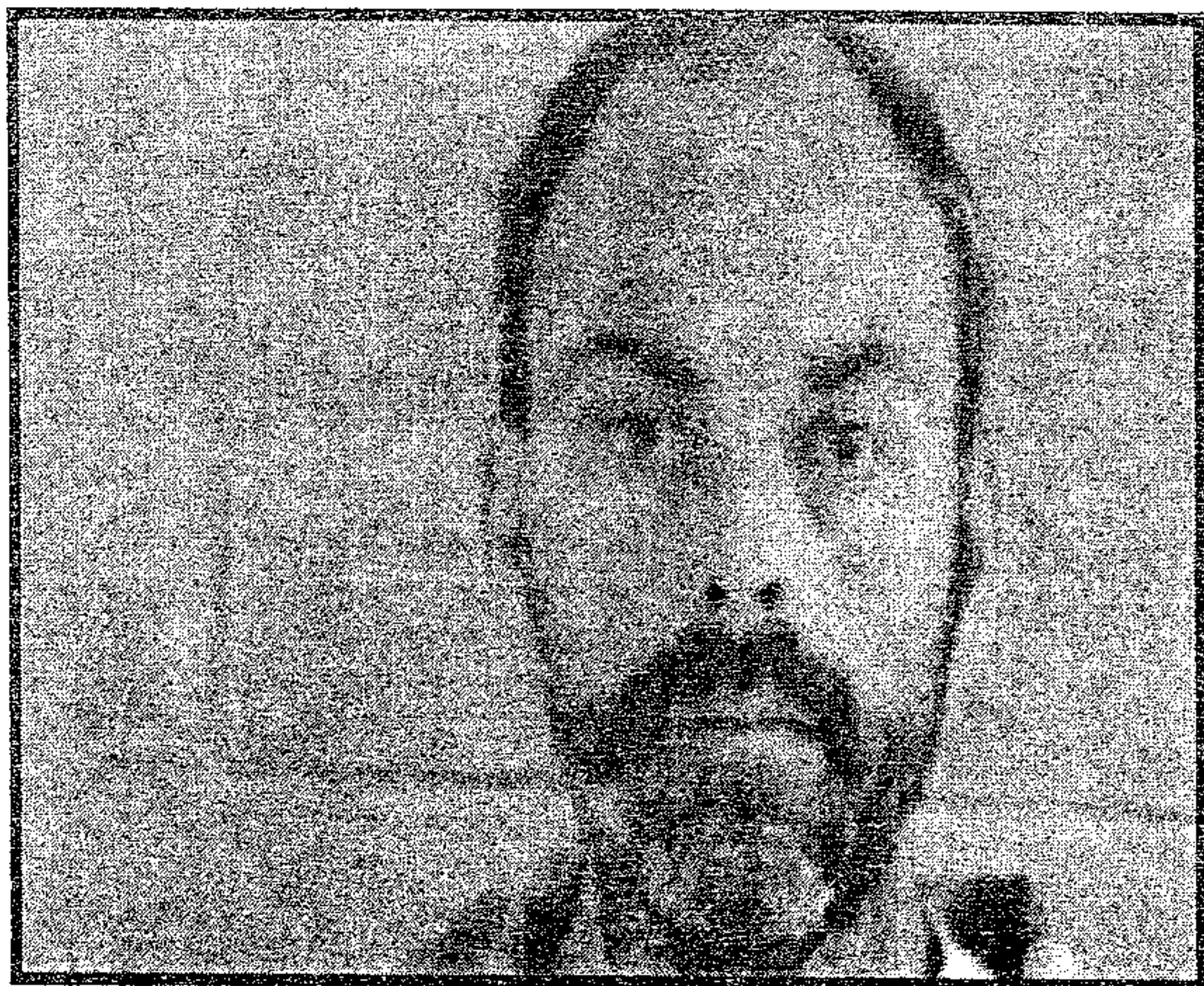
prize filled, multi-colored eggs.
