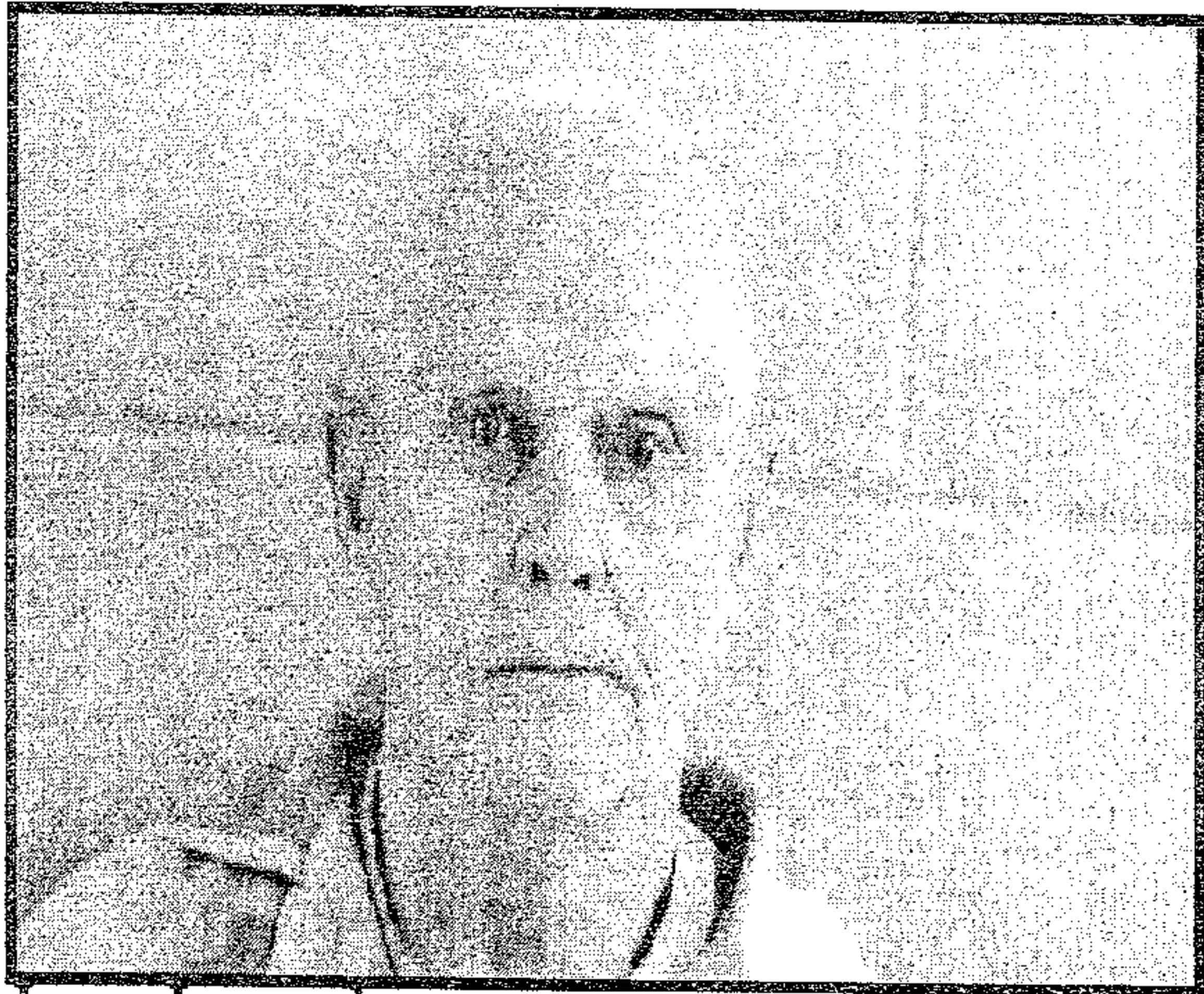
Enraged man pulls gun at Wendy's; charged with agg. assault

When the 79 year old man was in the parking lot he pulled a gun and threatened the victim with it.

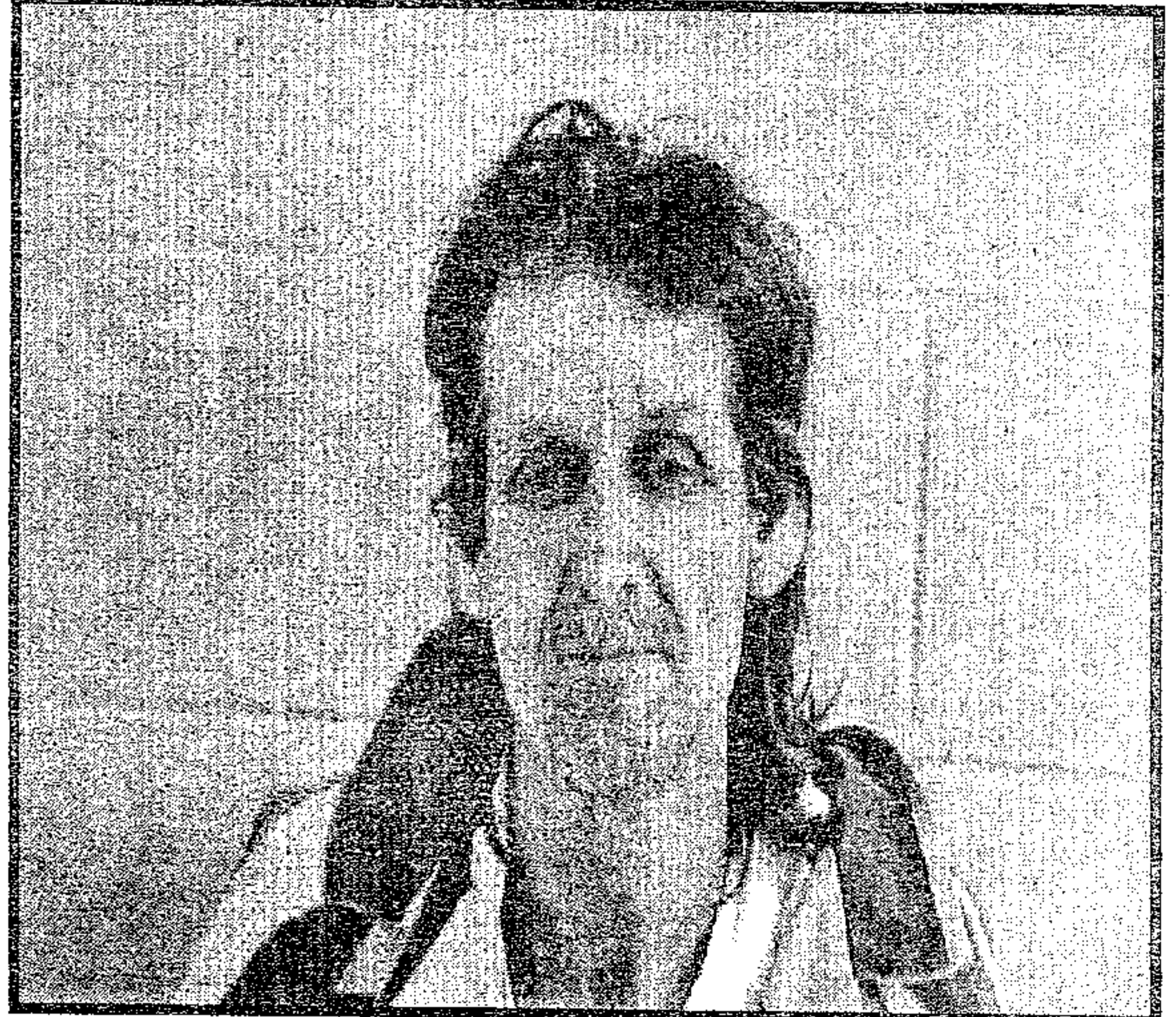
