**DUI**

Sandra Harrison, 46, Kerr Street Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, and Violation of Implied Consent. I; Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, did observe a White Chevy Lumina traveling on Highway 11 from Shaw Ferry Road. When Deputy first observed the vehicle it was traveling in the turn lane on Highway 11; however, then continued straight on Highway 11. Deputy had a difficult time observing the license plate because of the bright white light that was emitting from the passenger side tail light. The white light was very distracting and hinder the ability of a vehicle traveling behind it to see clearly. Deputy conducted a

traffic stop on the vehicle on Highway 11 at Highland Park and identified the driver as Sandra Carol Harrison. Harrison had an odor of alcoholic beverage upon her person which was more pronounced when she would speak, and later admit to having drank a 24 ounce beer. Harrison was also very nervous and uneasy. Harrison advised that she is used to being pulled over but was still very nervous about this particular time.

Deputy had Harrison exit the vehicle and Harrison agreed to perform standardized field sobriety tasks (SFST's). Harrison provided multiple clues of impairment while performing SFST's. Harrison was placed under arrest

for driving under the influence 1st offense; a subsequent search of Harrison's purse which was going with her to the Loudon County Jail revealed multiple medications: Amoxicillin 500 mg, Promethazine 25 mg. The Promethazine prescription bottle does clearly state on the outside, "may cause dizziness" as well as "Alcohol may intensify this effect". Harrison was read the Tennessee Implied Consent advisement and refused to provide a blood sample, as well as Harrison refused to sign the Tennessee Implied Consent advisement form. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.

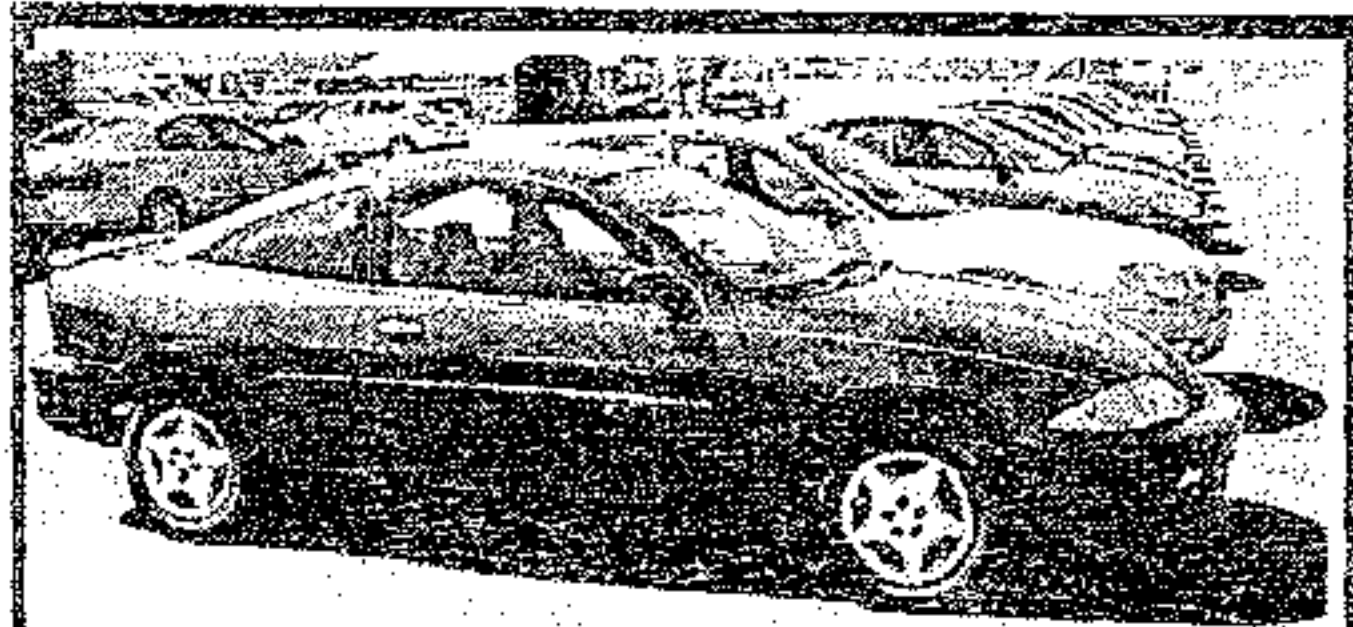

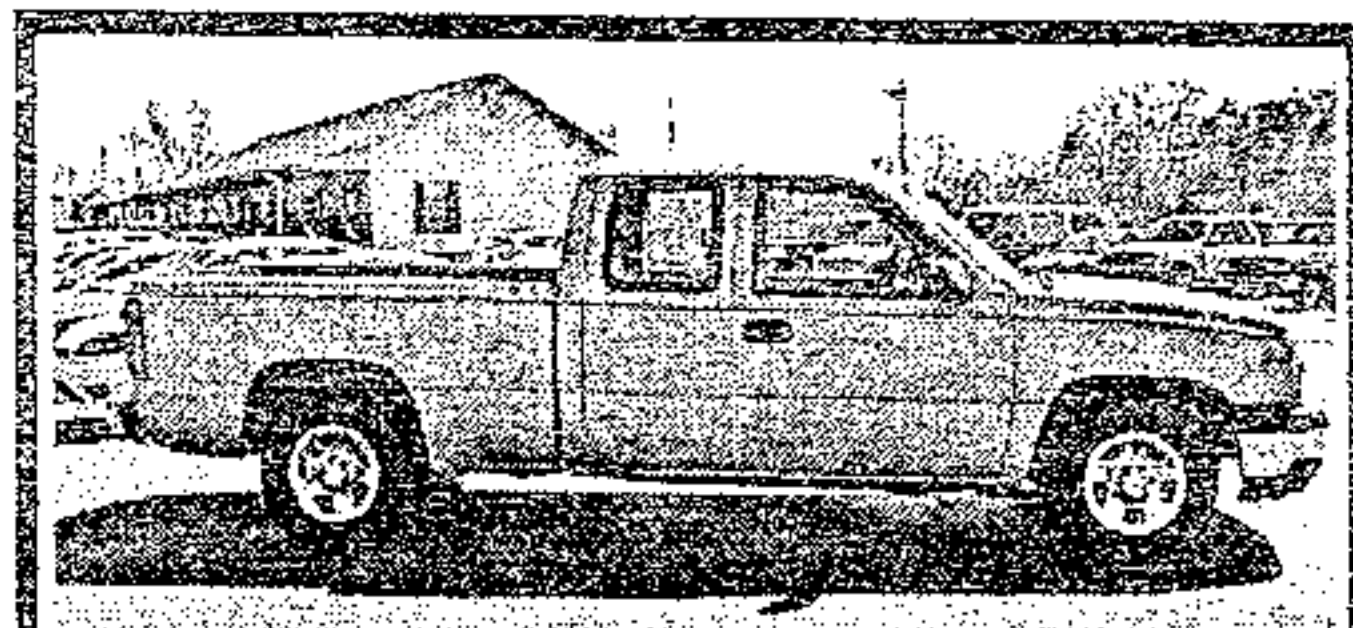

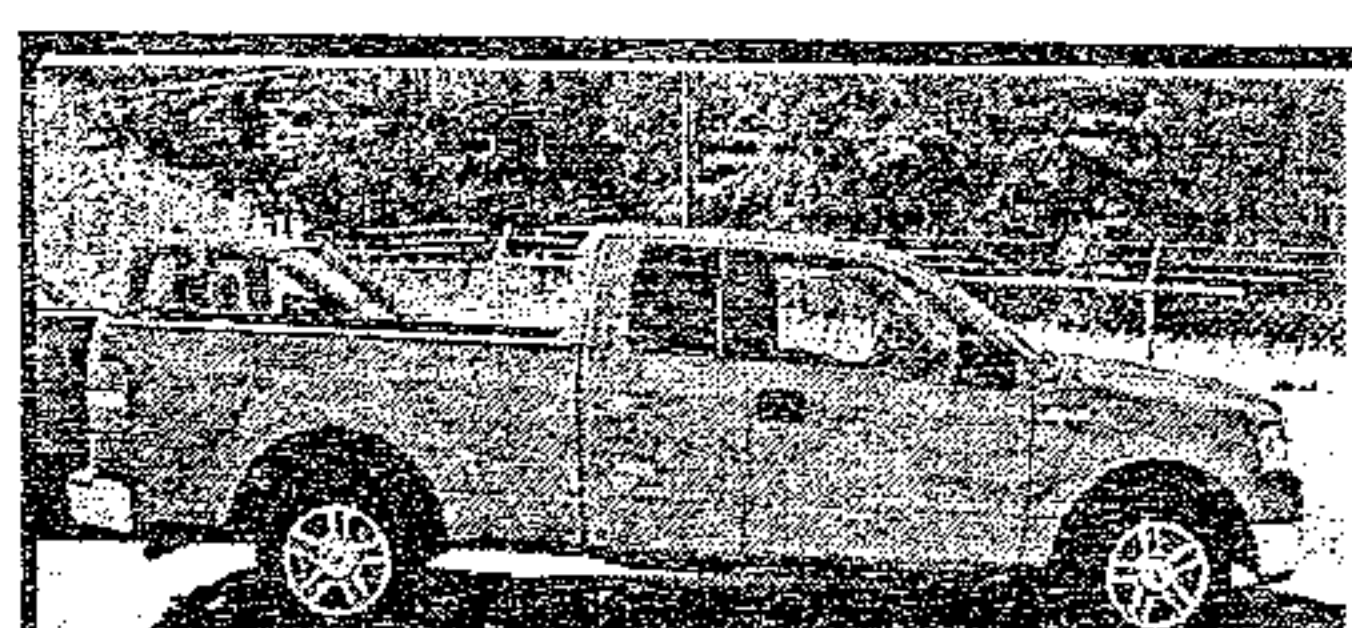
