Jerome Storie, 39, Tavern Hill Road Jonesborough, was charged with Poss. of handgun while under the influence, DUI, Poss. of SCH. II, and Violation of Implied Consent Law.

Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, did receive a dispatched call of a reckless driver on I-75 Northbound. Deputy was able to make contact with the suspected vehicle on I-75 Northbound at the 72 mile marker. Deputy was observing the vehicle, when the vehicle began rapidly changing lanes, had inconsistent speed and began driving in the emergency lane of the interstate. Storie did admit to having used Xanax as well as having a pistol in the front seat of the truck. The Xanax as well as a High Point Model CF380 was located in the vehicle with a magazine and ammunition in the magazine by Deputy Ketter. Deputy conducted Standardized Field Sobriety Tasks (SFST's) on Storie which he did poorly on. Storie was placed in custody and read the Tennessee Implied Consent Form, which he refused to provide a blood sample. A search incident to arrest of Storie's wallet revealed 1.5 Suboxone

stripes which he stated he does not have a prescription for. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.
