**Molly**

Ashley Davis, 21, Pinecrest Circle Lenoir City, was charged with DUI, Poss. of drug Para. and Poss. of SCH I Drug.

Alicia Aguilar, 20, Crooked Oak Drive Lenoir City, was charged with Poss. of drug Para., Poss. of SCH I drug, and Public Intoxication.

Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a vehicle traveling on Hwy 11 near the junction, the vehicle was traveling 50mph in a 40mph zone. Deputy initiated a traffic stop at Cusick cir. Deputy identified the drive as Ms. Ashley Davis and Alicia Aguilar. As Deputy approached the vehicle he noticed the females passing something between them and acting frantic. Upon contact with the females both fe-

males were very nervous and contorting their hands in an odd fashion, and continually rubbing things. Deputy could smell a strong odor of alcoholic beverage emitting from them but both stated they had not been drinking. Once out of the vehicle both subjects had difficulty walking and continued fidgeting for the entirety of the encounter. Deputy began to perform standardized field sobriety on Davis and her eyes did not react at all to a light stimulus. Deputy asked again if they had consumed anything at which point both subjects stated that they had just snorted molly off of a cd while in the car, but that none was left. Deputy continued field sobriety and Davis performed poorly was then arrested. Deputy did explain to

Davis that if she had anything hid on her that it would be an additional charge once at the jail, she did then state that she had molly hidden in her underwear. She was secured and SGT Bowen performed sobriety tasks with Aguilar, and she was then arrested. Deputy did deploy my K9 partner Dante to sniff the vehicle and he did alert, we did find the cd, with a white powdery residue on it. Once at

the jail Davis was searched and a clear bag with a white powder in it weighing approx. 1 gram, Davis did identify this as molly. Davis was advised of the Tennessee Implied consent and did opt to provide a blood sample. She was transported to the hospital for collection of the blood. Both Aguilar and Davis stated that the molly belonged to them both. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.

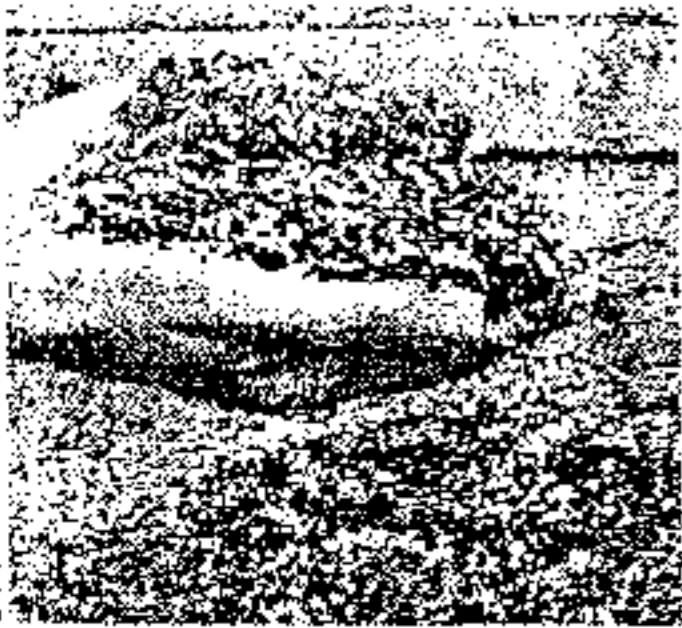

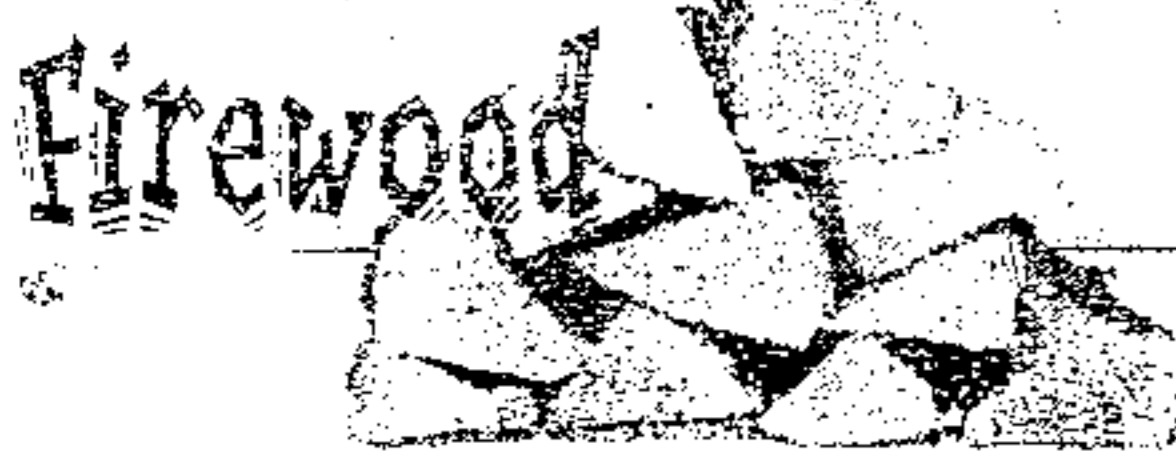

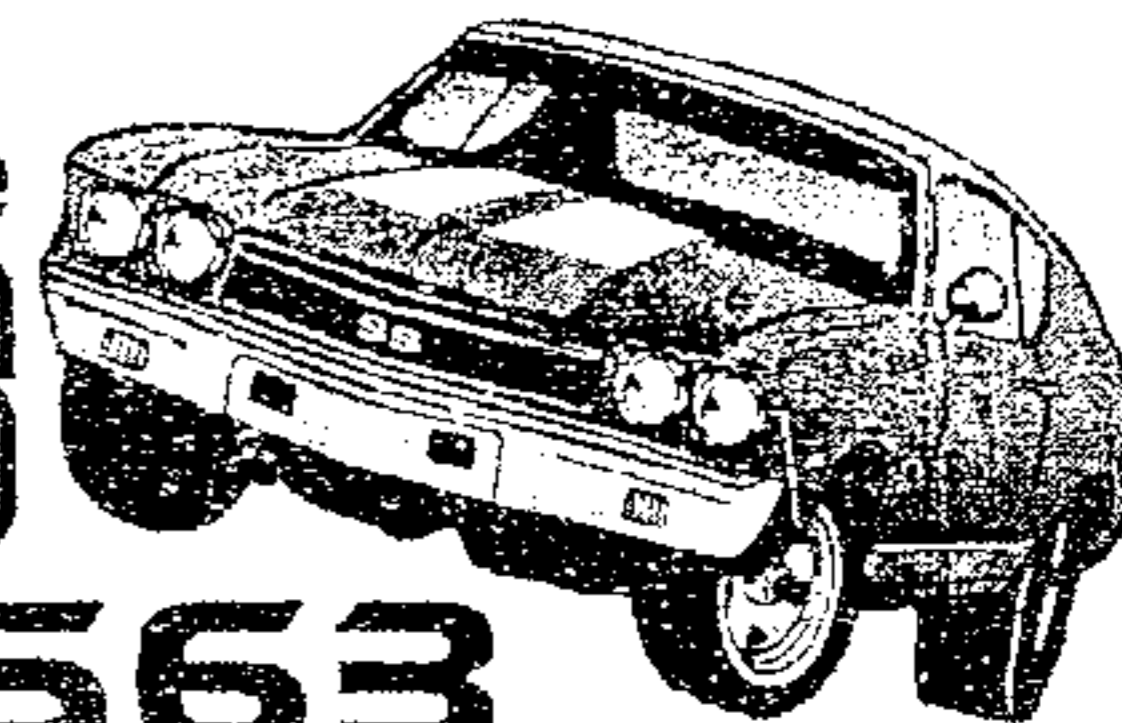

Devon Fowler, 34, Dover Road Morristown, was charged with Evading arrest, Resisting arrest, Reckless Endangerment, Poss. of drug Para., and Poss. of SCH. I & VI Drug.

Christopher Abney, 21, Lincoln Ave Morristown, was charged with Poss. of drug para., and Simple Possession/casual exchange.

Tia Buracker, 18, Jack Rogers Drive Kyles Ford Tn. was charged with Poss. of drug Para., Poss. of SCH. I & VI drug, and Tampering with evidence.

Jamika Wooden, 18, Twin Brook Dr. Cleveland, was charged with Simple Possession, and Poss. of drug Para.

Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a vehicle traveling north on I 75 near the 82 mile marker. The vehicle did cross the fog line on multiple occasions, and Deputy did initiate a traffic stop on the vehicle, the vehicle did continue traveling for a period of time, weaving in the emergency lane. Deputy approached the vehicle and noticed that there was four occupants inside. The driver was identified as Mr. Devon Fowler, the front passenger as Ms. Tia Buracker, and the two rear passengers as Mr. Christopher Abney, and Ms. Jamika Wooden. Fowler did state that they were on their way from Atlanta, and were headed home to Morristown. Fowler and Buracker seemed very nervous and were visibly shaking, Deputy also noticed several empty blunt wrappers all over the car, as well as the insides to those blunts strewn about

the car. Deputy asked if there was anything illegal in the car, to which Fowler told me adamantly several times that there was nothing. Deputy did deploy my K9 partner Dante to sniff the vehicle and he did alert on the vehicle. Fowler was asked again if there was anything illegal in the vehicle to which he and Buracker both stated that they had all four, within the last two hours, smoked marijuana in the

of the honey found inside a pill bottle. There was also a box of glass pipes found that Fowler and Buracker explained that they were used to smoke the honey. There were several baggies found with small amounts of marijuana in it, as well as large and medium sized mason jars with marijuana residue inside, along with catalogs and instruction books to grow marijuana. Inside the trunk there was found a mari-

uty Burley did still have his hands on Fowler and Fowler was dragging Burley into the path of the Tractor Trailer with him. Fowler stated that he wanted to end his life to save everyone else from getting in trouble. Deputy Hutchens, Deputy Burley and SGT Bowen were able to gain control of Fowler as he was still trying to throw himself into traffic.

Fowler was placed in the back of Burley's patrol car at which point he attempted to bring his hand cuffs to his front and get into the front of the patrol car. Fowler was then shackled and all four subjects were arrested and transported to the Loudon County Jail. While finishing the search of the vehicle a bag belonging Buracker was found that contained \$2700,

rolled into three different bundles bound by rubber bands, of \$100's, \$50's, and \$20's. This money did have a strong odor of marijuana emitting from it. Once at the jail, it was found that Buracker had been able to slip a handcuff and removed 45grams of marijuana and 16grams of mushrooms from her bra and attempted to conceal it in the back of the patrol car. She also had \$692 on her person when searched at the jail. The total \$3392 did belong to Buracker. During the encounter Buracker and Fowler repeatedly stated that the marijuana in the car was theirs. Wooden, and Buracker were advised of their rights and did willingly write statements about the events of the evening. Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, made the arrest.
