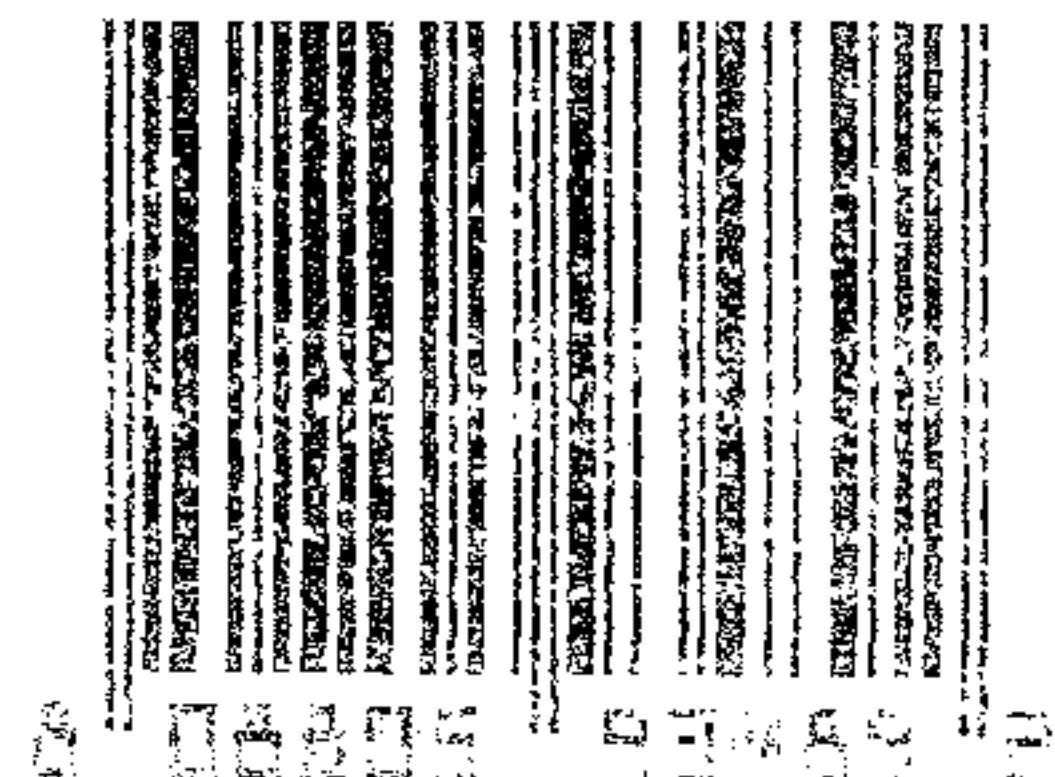

Co. Jail.

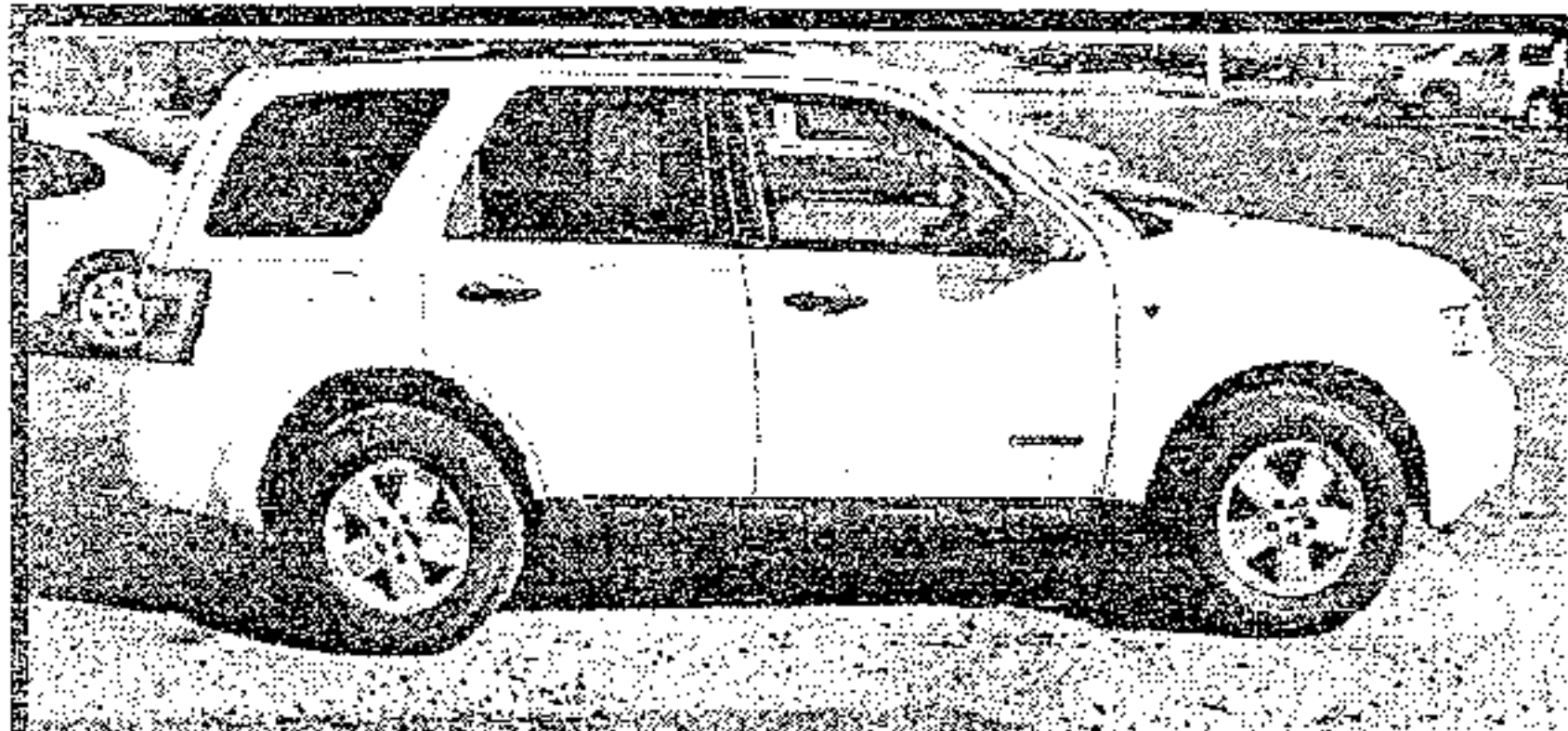

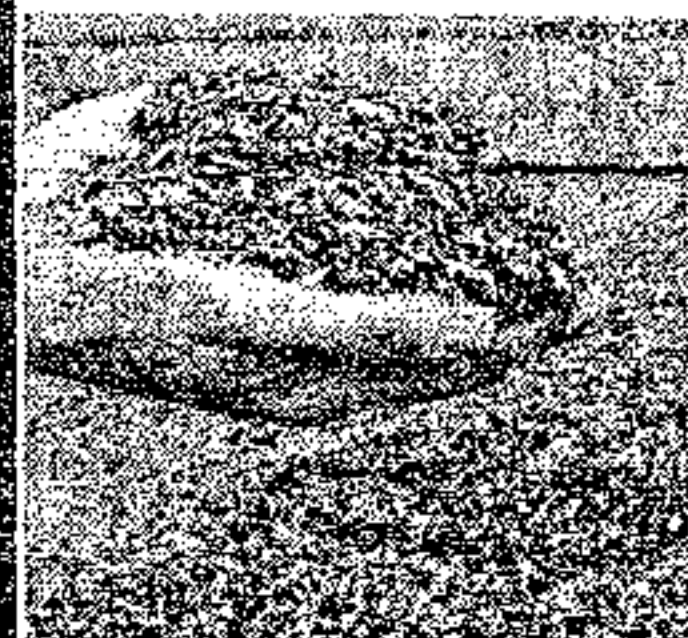
Deputy Billy Lewis LCSO, was dispatched to McDaniel Lane for a suspicious vehicle. Upon Deputy arrival A white male got out of the driver's seat and hurried over to the wood line and returned back to the car as Deputy approached the driver Mr. Anthony Robert Ritch stated that He and his passenger Mr. Justin Kelley where just

out enjoying the day and decided to come to this location to walk the trail. Deputy then asked Mr. Ritch why he went to the wood line and he stated that he had to pee when he seen me coming. Deputy then walked over to wood line and observed a syringe with a clear substance in it, a lock box partially covered with leaves and a belt that was looped. Upon giving both subjects the opportunity to be honest, Mr. Ritch admitted that all those items where theirs and Deputy pulled up just before they were able to inject the drugs. Deputy then searched the car and found several more syringes one with a clear substance that was located between the drivers and passengers front seat.

Deputy then located a loaded Ruger 380 sitting on the dash right in front of the driver's seat which belonged to Mr. Anthony Ritch and was loaded with one in the chamber. Shriners

Alexandria and Samantha Lynn are so thankful to be chosen this year to represent the Shriners in East Tennessee as Ambassadors. The Shriners are known for helping children, and Alexandria and Samantha have been under their care for the past twelve years.

The Shriners have provided services to the Lynn family to transport from the Morristown area to the Hospitals for necessary treatment. Additionally, the multiple doctors, surgeries, and other professional care from the Hospital staff are provided by the Shriners.

The child life group supports the attitudes of patients with play and loving encouragement. Shriners have transported family members to and from the Hospital, assisted with housing for families, provided food and when necessary even spiritual help during family's hospital stays. When this family lost all their belongings, the Shriners began gathering the necessities for the family, helping immediately while still in the Hospital.

On Monday, March 18th, 2002 around 4:30am, tragedy struck, as did lightning, forever changing the lives of Alexandria and Samantha Lynn. The lightning caused a fire that quickly spread through the duplex trapping Gena Lynn, the girl's mother, and Alexandria inside the home. Neighbors were able to break a window, which allowed Gena to pass Alexandria through to safety before getting her own self out. The father, Rodney, was able to exit through the front door of the duplex with their other daughter Samantha. Both Gena

and Rodney were transported to the University of Tennessee Hospital and then on to Erlanger Hospital in Chattanooga, where Gena died seven days later, as a result of her burns. Alexandria and Samantha were also transported to the University of Tennessee Hospital, and from there flown to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Cincinnati, Ohio – both children in critical condition.

Alexandria, age two, had burns that covered approximately 47% of her body. Samantha, nine months old, was wearing flame retardant pajamas; however, her face, head, and both hands were severely burned. Both girls also suffered throat and lung injuries from inhaling heated smoke and gases from the fire.

Both children had breathing tubes and numerous surgeries.

Shriners Doctors, and Nurses, began to graph skin to as many areas as possible. Once able to breathe without difficulties the tubes were removed and physical therapy began. Samantha was able to come home after a month, and Alexandria was home two weeks after that. The girls wore garments specifically designed to apply pressure to affected areas to help keep the scars from rising and aid in healing, and they also had specially made mask to wear to help with facial scars.

As Alexandria and Samantha have grown the burned areas have been treated multiple times. Because scarred skin does not grow like the skin on other areas of the body, it caused tightening in the joints, requiring additional surgeries to cut and add skin to allow for normal use of hands, feet

and legs. Surgical and laser facial reconstruction have also been an ongoing process. These various surgeries will continue until Alexandria and Samantha are fully grown.

Alexandria (Alex) is now in the 8th grade at Rutledge Middle School, and this is her second year in the Beta Club. She is very excited about her future, as she aspires to be Pediatric Doctor someday. Alex is active in her church and school; she enjoys the YOKE program along with playing clarinet in the band. She also enjoys school and is in advanced classes; Alex says any time they get put in a group she is the one to speak in front of the class. At church Alex has helped lead singing and also played her clarinet. She is very attentive to detail and has a sensitive heart; she

feels very deeply when others hurt.

Samantha (Sammie) is in the 7th grade at Rutledge Middle School, and is in her first year of Beta club. Samantha has helped lead singing at church and has also sung special songs. Samantha has been selected to attend leadership conferences in Washington DC, and again in Nashville. Samantha is very sensitive to the needs of others, and has the ability to overcome most any trial that comes at her. For Sammie, algebra is a difficult concept to learn, however, her grades would not make you think so. Like her sister, Sammie also enjoys the YOKE program. Sammie is not sure what she wants to be when she grows up; however, her teachers know she will be a leader in whatever she decides to do.

Alex and Sammie's father passed away a few years ago, so they now live with their Aunt and Uncle in Rutledge. They have a brother and sister in Florida who they do not get to see very of-

Several pipes and "bongs" were found in Schlemmer's bedroom. Two packs of Energizer lithium batteries was found in the bedroom belonging to
