

Man charged with homicide following I75 Crash

Jacob Nagy, 36, Brighton Way Ga., was charged with Vehicular Homicide, Vehicular Assault x2, DUI, Implied Consent Law, and Reckless Endangerment x7.

According to the reports, Trooper Ryan Smith THP, was dispatched to a crash on Interstate 75 at the 83mm. Upon arrival Trooper found a white vehicle had crashed head on into four other vehicles while driving northbound in the southbound lanes.

According to the report, On 05/24/2014, Deputy Chris Hutchens LCSO, did observe a vehicle waiting on HWY 11 east to turn on Highland Park drive. while driving north-bound in the south-bound lanes. A female passenger in vehicle 2 sustained fatal injuries due to the crash. The driver in vehicle 2 sustained serious injuries and was transported to UT Medical.

The driver of vehicle 3 sustained serious injuries and was transported to Ft. Loudon Medical. Vehicle 3 had 4 occupants and they were checked and cleared by EMS.

There was also a 5th and 6th vehicle that was involved but did not impact any other vehicle.

WATER SYSTEM FLUSHING PROGRAM

The Lenoir City Utilities Board and Lenoir City Fire Department will be conducting our semi-annual water distribution system wide flushing program per Tennessee Department of Environment & Conservation Water Quality Control Requirements. The Flushing Program will occur for LCUB customers on Monday, June 9, 2014, at 2:00 p.m. until 10:00 p.m. thru Thursday, June 12, 2014, at 8:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. The program goals are to identify problems in the water system and ultimately have them corrected. When fire hydrants are flowed, iron deposits in the water lines are agitated. This may cause a brown discoloration to the water in the area which is being flushed. This condition is only temporary and will normally correct itself in a number of hours. During this period of flushing, we recommend that you flow your cold water prior to use to determine if there is any discoloration. While the water is still safe to consume, we recommend not washing any white clothes without first testing the water for discoloration. If your water is discolored, it will clear up on its own under normal usage over a period of time. It is also best to limit the use of your hot water until it's clear, as this will keep the iron deposits from going into your water heater. You may also notice a drop in water pressure during these times; however, the water pressure should return to normal within a short period of time. If you continue to experience difficulty with your water pressure or discoloration on Monday, June 16, 2014, please contact LCUB at (865) 986-6591 to report the problem.
