Three charged after THP shooting on I75

All three suspects are in custody following an officer-involved shooting Friday morning on I-75 near the Philadelphia exit. According to sources, a trooper pulled a beige Buick sedan over for suspicion of DUI at about 8:15 a.m. Some sort of struggle happened before the car drove off. During the incident, the trooper fired shots, but officials don't know how many.

At that point according to Sheriff Tim Guider, the suspects got off exit 72 then to Hwy 11. An occupant of the vehicle jumped out of the vehicle and called 911

during our conversations with others. We are not ashamed to acknowledge our children as part of our family. In fact, we are usually looking for opportunities to tell others about our children, break out pictures of them and brag about their accomplishments. I have one serving our country in the military and one about to graduate college with honors.....see, here I go bragging about my own!

As humans we are not ashamed to talk about the things we consider important to us. We're not only unashamed, we can't help but talk about them. If the previous statement is true in your life, and I believe it is, allow me to ask one more question:

When was the last time you told someone about your relationship with Jesus? How long has it been since you bragged about His accomplishments in your life? Do you have a photo of Jesus in your wallet that you whip out with your kid's baseball photo or prom picture to show your friends?

When the Apostle Paul was writing to the Christians in Rome before being shipped there in chains he said the following:

Romans 1:8-17 (NKJV)
First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that your faith is spoken of throughout the whole world. For God as my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of His Son, that without ceasing

I make mention of you in my prayers, making request if, by some means, now at last I may find a way in the will of God to come to you. For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift, so that you may be established - that is, that I may be encouraged together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me.

Now I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that I often planned to come to you (but was hindered until now), that I might have some fruit among you also, just as among the other Gentiles. I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise. So, as much as is in me, I am ready to preach the gospel to you who are in Rome also.

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from

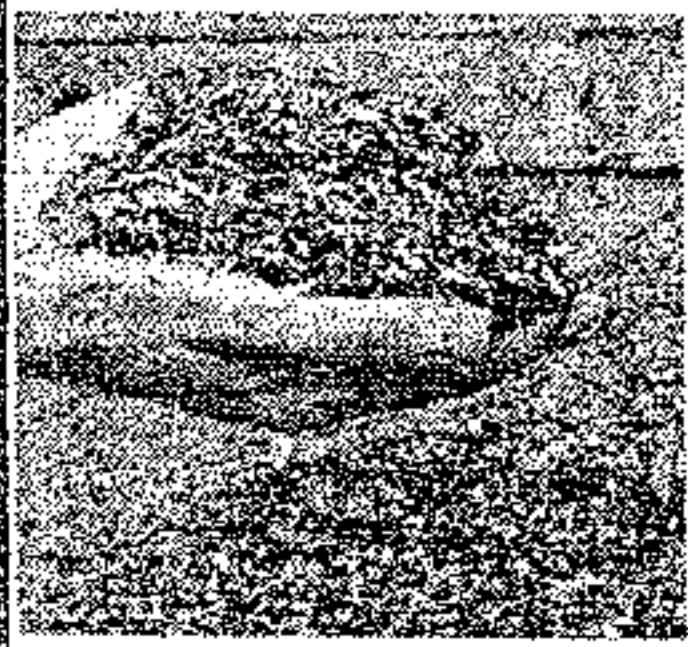
faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."

Jesus was obviously important to Paul! As professing Christians, shouldn't our conversations be similar to those of Paul?
