
Three THPIne Good News charged after shooting on 175

during our conversations with others. We are not ashamed to acknowledge our children as part of our family. In fact, we are usually looking for opportunities to tell others about our children, break out pictures of them and brag about their accomplishments. I

have one serving our country in the military and one about to graduate college with honors....see, here I go bragging about my own!

As humans we are not ashamed to talk about the things we consider important to us. We're not only unashamed, we can't help but talk about them. If the previous statement is true in your life, and I believe it is, allow me to ask one more question:



When was the last time you told someone about your relationship with Jesus? How long has it been since you bragged about His accomplishments in your life? Do you have a photo of Jesus in your wallet that you whip out with your kid's baseball photo or prompicture to show your friends?

When the Apostle Paul was writing to the Christians in Rome before being shipped there in chains he said the following:

Romans 1:8-17 (NKJV) First, I thank my God through Jesus Christ for you all, that yourfaith is spoken of throughout the whole world. For God as my witness, whom I serve with my spirit in the gospel of His Son, that without ceasing

I make mention of you in my prayers, making request if, by some means, now at last I may find a way in the will of God to come to you. For I long to see you, that I may impart to you some spiritual gift, so that you may be established – that is, that I may be encouraged together with you by the mutual faith both of you and me.

Now I do not want you to be unaware, brethren, that I often planned to come to you (but was hindered until now), that I might have some fruit among you also, just as among the other Gentiles. I am a debtor both to Greeks and to barbarians, both to wise and to unwise. So, as much as is in me, I am ready to preach the gospel to you who are in Rome also.

For I am not ashamed of the gospel of Christ, for it is the power of God to salvation for everyone who believes, for the Jew first and also for the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God is revealed from

faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith."

Jesus was obviously important to Paul! As professing Christians, shouldn't our conversations be similar to those of Paul? If Christ has given us the breath within us this morning, if Jesus has allowed us to marry a spouse with which to share our lives, if He has blessed us with the children that we so often brag about, shouldn't He be worth at least an honorable mention in our conversations with others?

What if the next person you are talking to does not have a relationship with Christ? What if God has placed them in your path to plant a seed of the gospel in their hearts? Suppose for a moment that while bragging on your spouse and while bragging on your children that you mentioned the importance of your relationship with our Creator and Savior
