Duo charged with First Baptist theft by LCPD

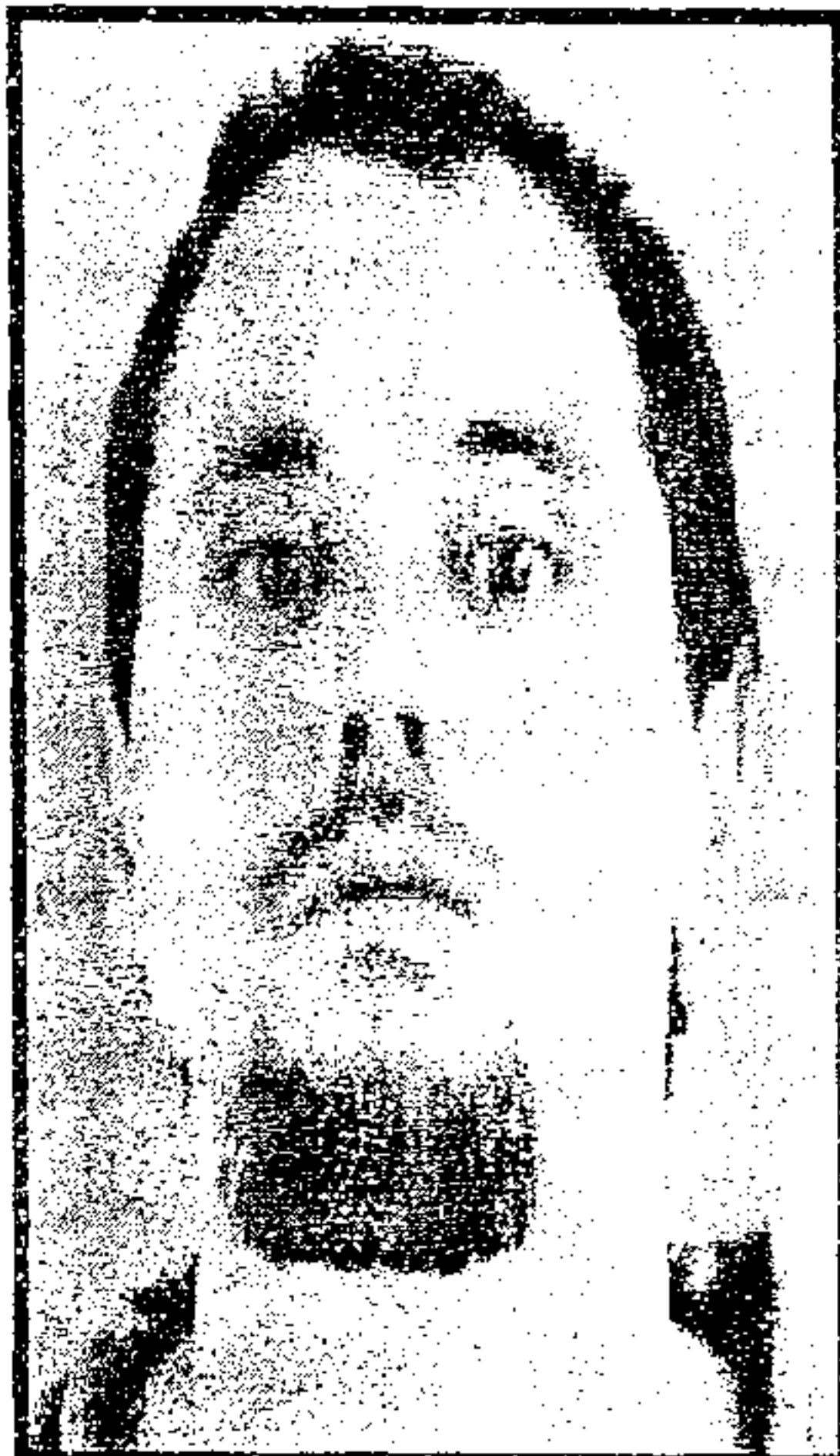
As a result of photos being released and information coming in about a theft and burglary that occurred at First Baptist Church in Lenoir City has gained fruition.

FBI Knoxville Acting Special Agent in Charge Timothy Slater, Knoxville Field Office, announces that during the past week, FBI Knoxville, together with the Knox County Sheriff's Office, Hamilton County Sheriff's Office, Chattanooga Police Department, Red Bank Police Department, and Homeland Security Investigations, conducted Operation Cross

Country VIII to address commercial child sex trafficking throughout the United States. The operation included enforcement actions in several cities throughout East Tennessee and led to 17 arrests. Eight women were arrested for prostitution, four women were arrested for promoting prostitution, two women were

is part of the Innocence Lost National Initiative that was established in 2003 by the FBI's Criminal Investigative Division, in partnership with the Department of Justice and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, to address the growing problem of child prostitution.

To date, the FBI and its task force partners have recovered more than 3,400 children from being exploited. The investigations and subsequent 1,450 convictions have resulted in lengthy sentences, including 14 life terms.

The Innocence Lost National Initiative brings state and federal law enforcement agencies, prosecutors, and social service providers from across

the country to NCMEC for training.

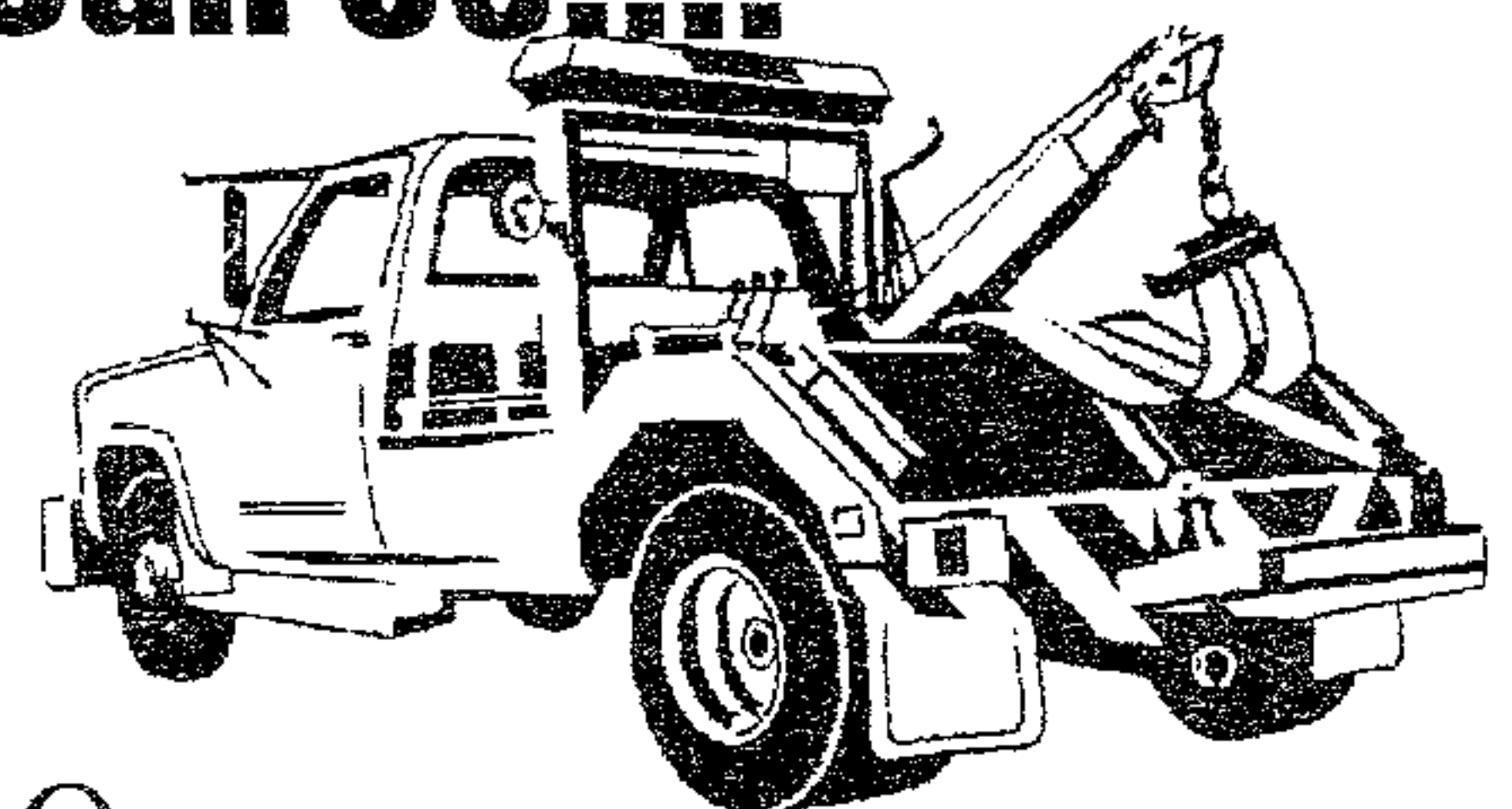

Tressler S. Hardin - age 92 of Lenoir City, TN formerly of Waynesville, Ohio passed away June 23, 2014. He was born September 26, 1921 in Waynesville, son of the late Thomas and Rose L. (Sharp) Hardin. Mr. Hardin was a loyal and active member of Waynesville United Methodist Church having served a Lay Leader, Administrative Board Chairman, Finance

Chairman, Auditor, Union Representative, District Stewart and taught Sunday School for 19 years. Tressler loved music and his bass voice is missed in the Church Choir where he sang for 50 years. He was a graduate of Waynesville High School, Miami-Jacobs Business College and the University of Dayton. He was employed by Dayton Power and Light Company as an accountant retiring in 1982 following 40 years of service. Tressler was a World War II veteran. He proudly served his country in the 9th Air Corp in India, England and France. For many years he and his sister, Virginia were co-treasurers of the Waynesville Country Fair. In 1991 they were honored as "Citizens of the Year" also known as the "George Arnold Service Award". He

was a member of the Wayne Township Fire Department in Waynesville and received the honor of "Member of the Year" in 1993. Tressler retired in April 2004 after 30 yeras of services. He was well known throughout Warren County as an EMT and CPR instructor. In 2004, he was one of six in the Greater Miami Valley to receive the Extra Measure of Service Award for outstanding service and dedication in the field of Emergency Medical Services. For 11 years he had served on the Executive Board as Secretary-Treasurer of the Ohio Emergency Medical Technician Instructors Association. In May, 2004 he was honored to be inducted as a member of the Waynesville Athletic Hall of Fame in recognition for his 30 years of service to Waynesville

High School as a medic at all home football and basketball games and was also inducted into the Wayne Local Schools Hall of Fame in May 2005. He was a charter member and past president of the Waynesville Lions Club where he received the 100 % Presidents Award from the District Governor in 1973. Tressler had been serving as a board member and club chaplain; life member of the American Legion Post #615; life member of the Warren County Branch of the American Heart Association; member of the Waynesville Area Chamber of Commerce; member of the Warren County Trustees;

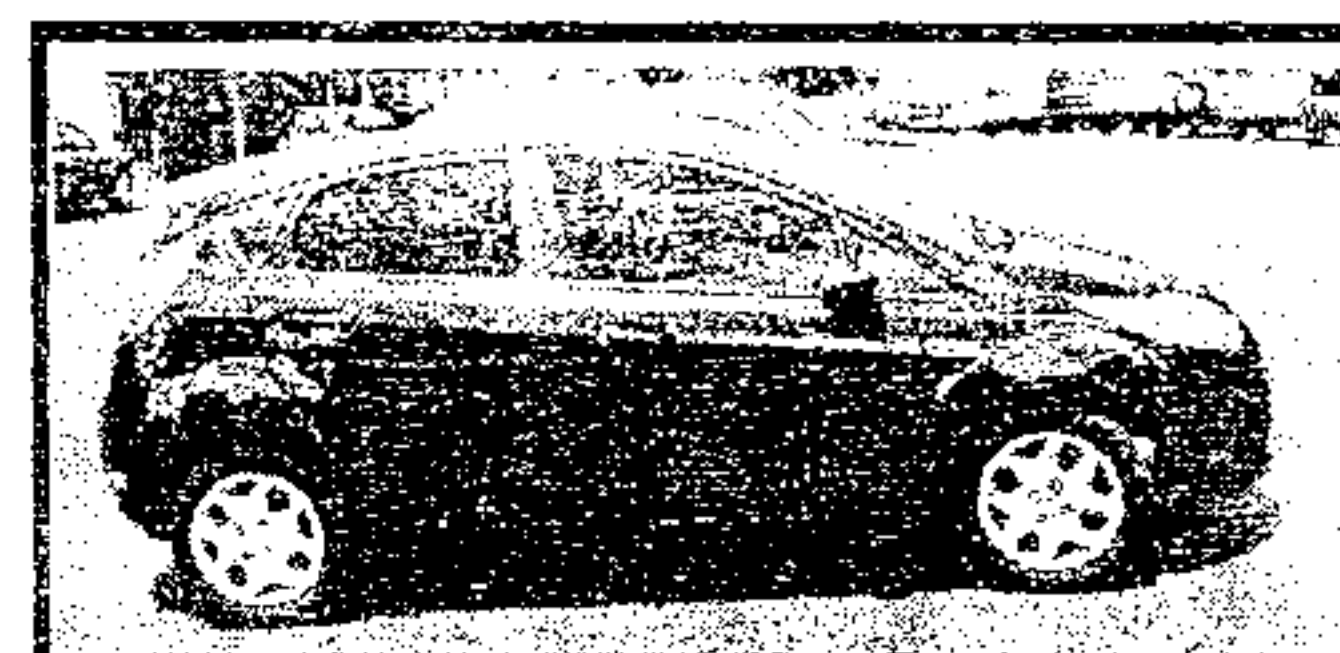

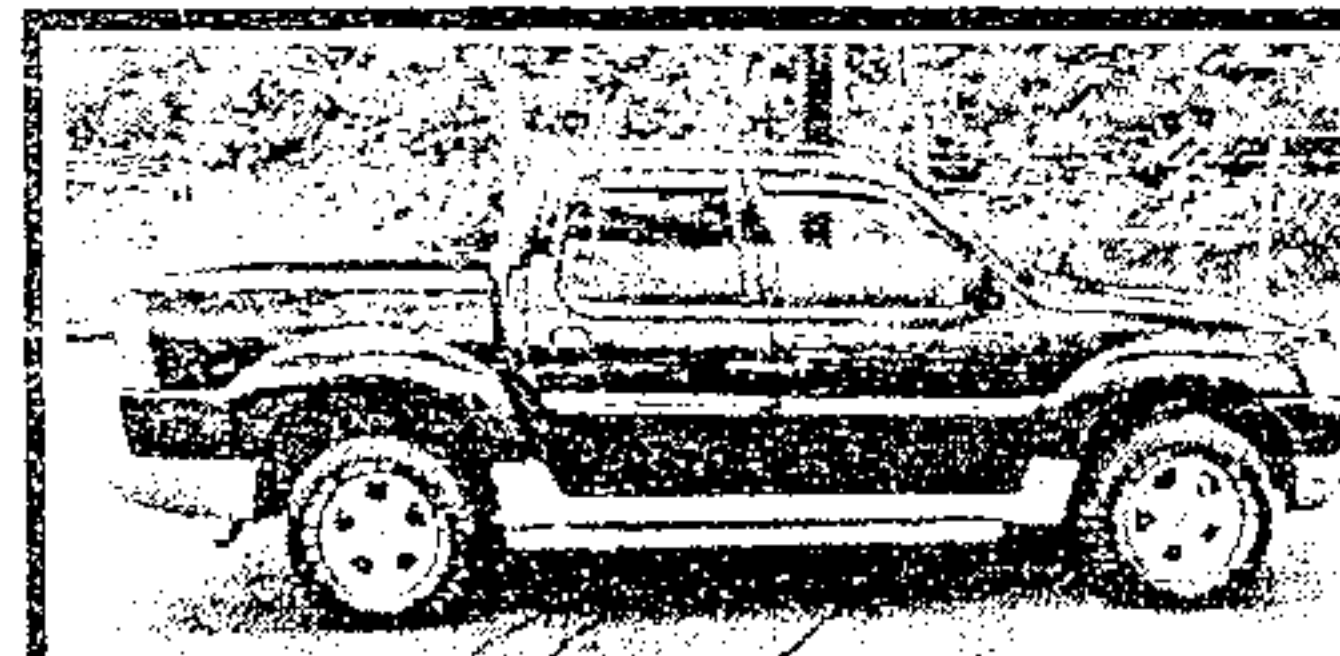

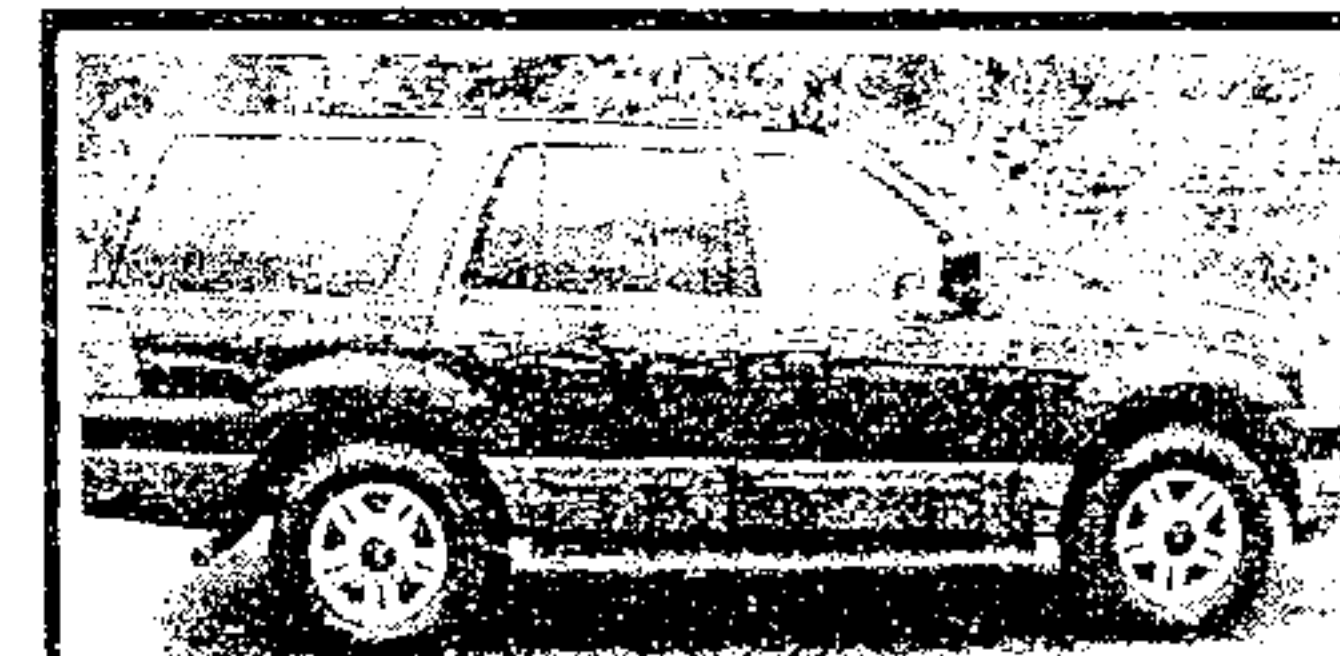
