The complainant for the original call was Deputy J. Pistole and Deputy Pistole did observe the afore mentioned vehicle traveling at a high rate of speed

and failing to maintain its lane. Deputy Burley began observing it on Interstate 75 northbound at the 72 mile marker where the vehicle was inconsistent with it speed ranging from 80 miles per hour to 60 miles per hour and left its lane of travel on multiple occasions by driving on the shoulder and in two lanes of travel at the same time. Deputy Burley conducted a traffic stop on the vehicle as soon as possible because your Deputy was overly concerned for the safety of the general public, on Interstate 75 northbound at the 74 mile marker however; the vehicle did not stop until the 75 mile marker. Deputy Burley upon initial approach did make contact with the driver, Stephen Mi-

chael Templeton; who had slurred speech, red / watery bloodshot eyes, was unable to focus and multi-task. Templeton had in plain view a lid to a beer bottle and when asked Templeton admit to having drank beer as well as taking his medication prior to law enforcement contact. Templeton's medication consisted of Hydrocodone, Gabeapentin, Tramadol and Clonazapam. After Templeton provided consent to search, Deputy Hutchens and Sgt. Bowen located two more beer bottle tops in the vehicle as well as of which Templeton had 5 Clonazapam, 6 Gabeapentin, 19 Tramadol and 17 Hydrocodone. Templeton only had a prescription for the Hydrocodone. Templeton had multiple medical

conditions which prohibited him from doing standardized field sobriety tasks and as such modified field sobriety tasks where conducted. Templeton did poorly on modify field sobriety and as such as placed under arrest. After being placed under arrest methamphetine and approximately 3 grams of marijuana were recovered in Templeton's wallet. After being advised of his Miranda warnings, Templeton admits to smoking marijuana and advised a friend provided him the methamphetine. Templeton was placed under arrest and consented to a blood draw under Tennessee Implied Consent which was conducted at the Ft. Loudon E.R. Deputy Brandon Burley LCSO, made the arrest.
