Man in love with 11 year old gets stabbed during visit

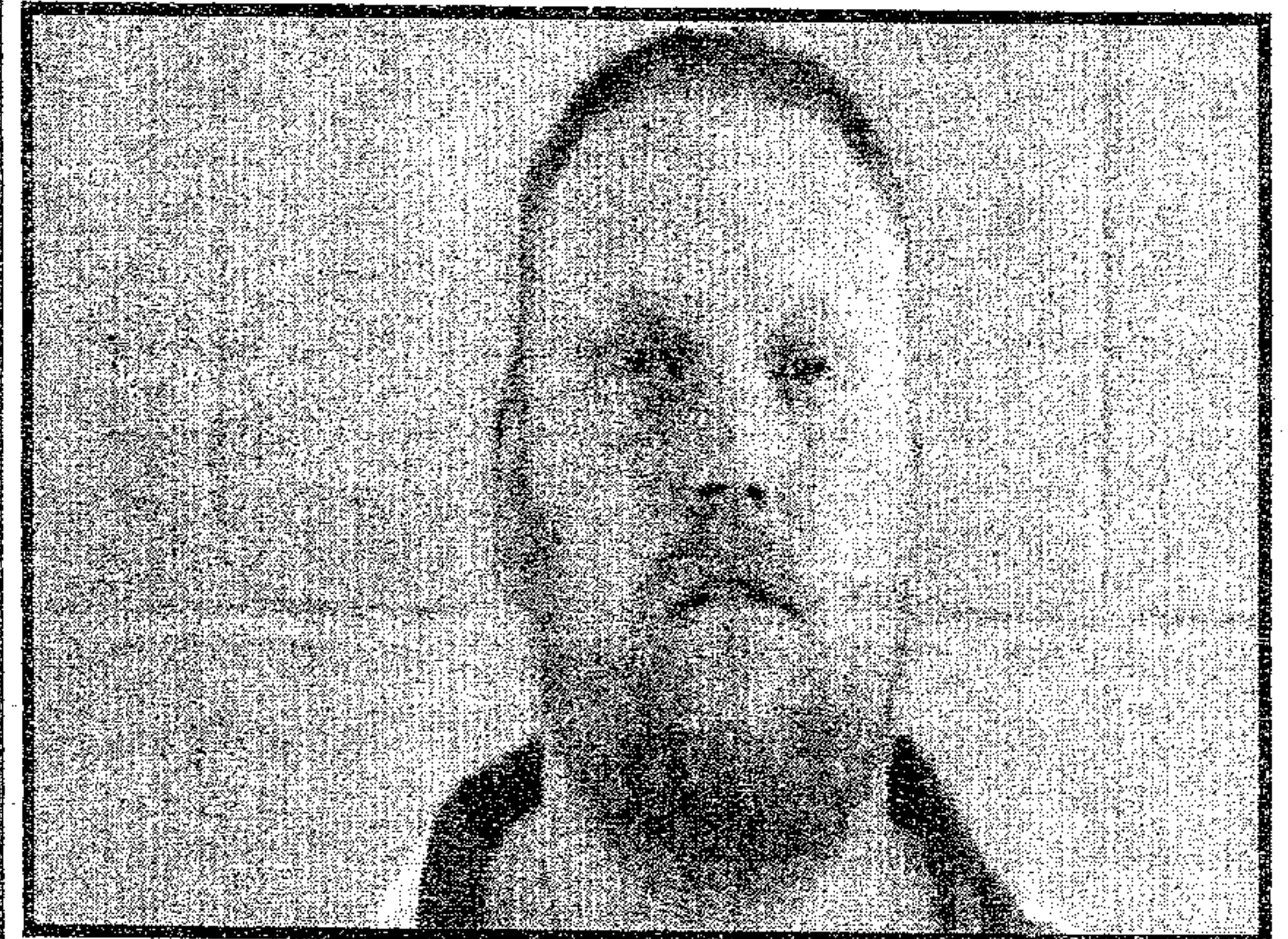
Michael Frazier, 29, Jena Road Greenback, was charged with Contributing to the Delinquency of a Minor and Aggravated Burglary.

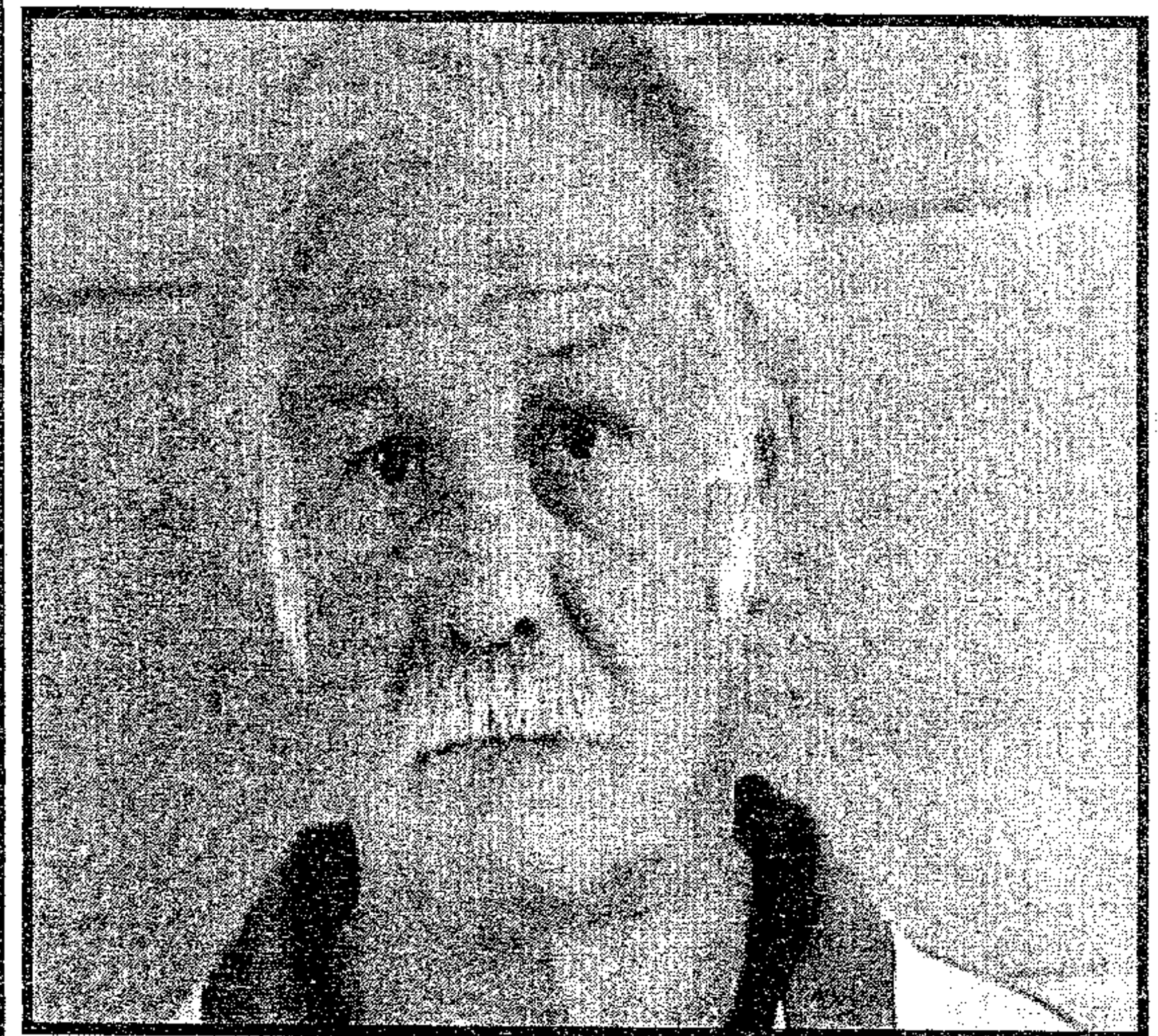

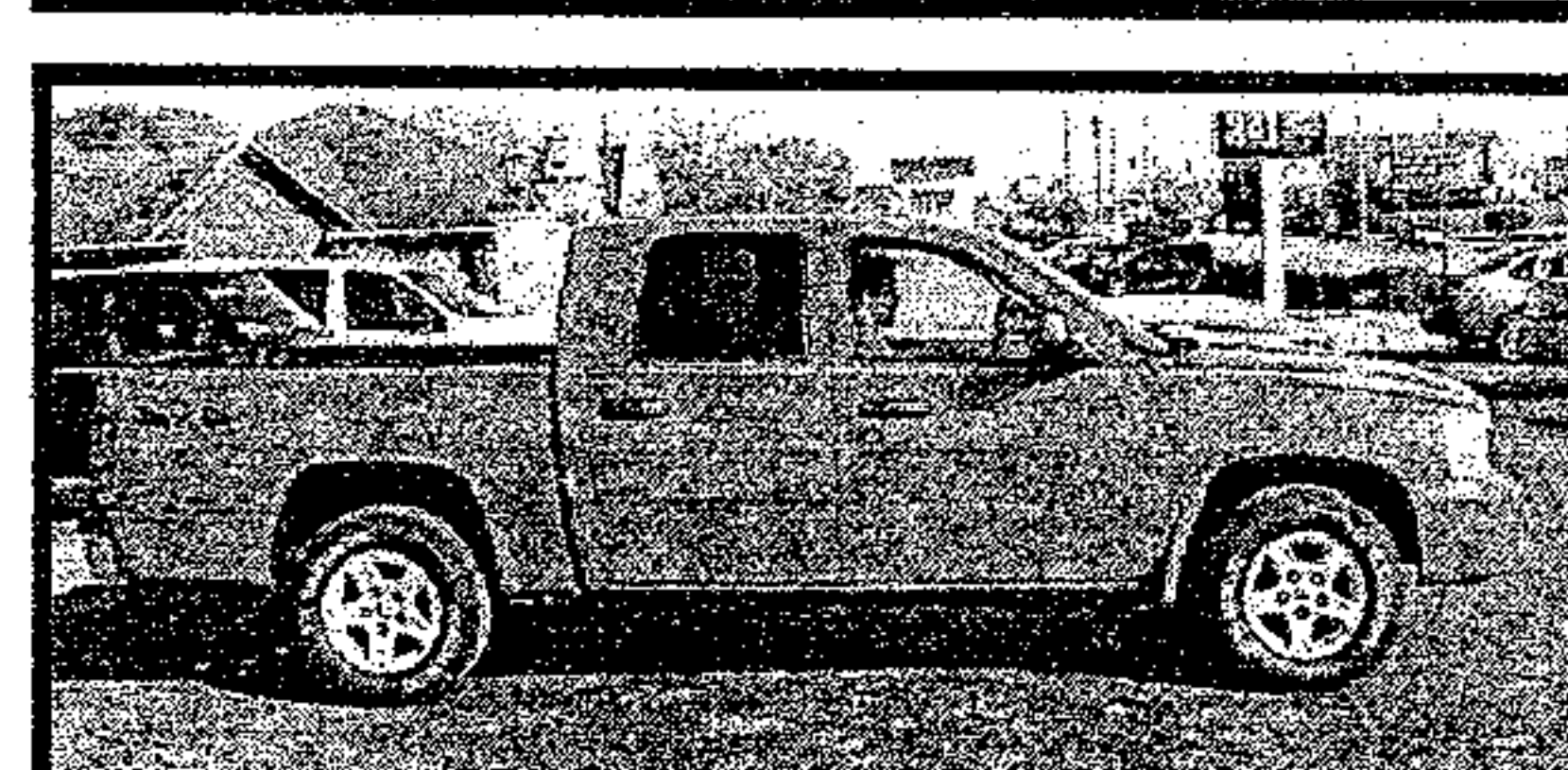

Victim also advised that his daughter, (age 11), told him that a man had been sticking his hand in her window and touching her. He then said that he watched the man's hand enter his residence through the window. He then stabbed his hand with a black Gerber knife, attempting to stick it to the window sill. The man then ran away behind the residence. Vic-

tim also mentioned that he thought the man had been texting his daughter on her Boost Mobile cell phone. Daughter also said, in her statement, that Michael Frazier had visited her window a few nights before.

Michael Frazier was examined by EMS on scene. He was then transported to Fort Loudon Medical Center by SGT J. Bowen 912 for evaluation. Upon being contacted on the above incident this Deputy went to the scene and took possession of the knife and the cell phone. Deputy also talked to the father of the victim. He advised that he saw Mr. Frazier walking back and forth before the incident in front of their home.

Upon interviewing Mr. Frazier he admitted sticking his hand through the child's window. Michael advised that he knew it was wrong and had no permission to do so. Michael advised that he loved Victim.
